College Now/Start Program

The College Now/START program is excited to begin accepting student applications for the Fall 2025 cohort through alternative admissions at the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth. Due to the program's limited space for incoming students; applicants are strongly encouraged to apply early and complete an in-person meeting with the admissions team prior to April 1st, 2025. Students interested in the College Now/START Program can apply by using the UMassD online application or the Common Application. Please note when completing the application, students <u>must select either College Now (COLNW) or START (START) as their 1st choice of major</u> and second choice should be their major of interest. Students interested in applying to the College Now Program must be either a U. S. citizen or a permanent U. S. resident for at least one year and cannot exceed 24 transferable college credits. Although not limited to students who only meet the criteria below, applicants who satisfy one of the following criteria below are encouraged to enroll and receive support services through this program: (1) Be of low-income status, as defined by federal guidelines and/or (2) Be first generation college bound.

Students interested in applying through the START Program must be pursuing calculus-based majors, such as Engineering, Math, Computer Science or Physics.

- Applicants applying to the College Now/START Program are not admissible through the Office of Admissions.
- Applicants must demonstrate the ability to complete developmental and credited courses in order to matriculate into the university.
- College Now/START is a Fall admissions program only.

SAT Information

Are you planning on taking the SAT? Here are some important deadlines to remember:

- Oct 18th is the deadline to register for the Nov 2nd test
- Nov 22nd is the deadline to register for the Dec 7th test

THIS WEEK - Taking the PSAT? Check Out This Important Information

Students who will be taking the PSAT should report to the high school by 7:30 am on October 12th with a charged chromebook and a pen & pencil (for scrap paper). As a reminder, all PSATs are digital this year. Students taking the PSAT will have a BlueBook App Practice test during Bulldog Block on October 8th (Sophomores) & October 9th (Juniors). Students will be added to these Bulldog Block sessions by guidance and should report to the media room for the practice.

Students must use a school issued device to test and should have their device with them during the Bluebook App Practice. Any student who needs a school issued device should let Mrs. Millette know ASAP. Testing room locations for the 12th will be emailed to students on October 9th. 

SEL Tip of the Week

You are more than enough! When you feel like you're not enough, it's easy to get caught up in thoughts about what you should be or should have. Instead, try to shift your focus to what makes you unique. Being "enough" isn't about being perfect—it's about valuing yourself just as you are. One way to start is by acknowledging your strengths. Take a moment to write down three things you're good at, no matter how small. Maybe you're a good friend, or you're great at listening—these qualities matter more than you might realize. Also, remember to focus on your effort, not just the outcome. You don't have to ace everything to be enough; showing up and putting in the work is a success in itself. It's also important to avoid falling into the comparison trap. When you measure yourself against others, you lose sight of what's special about you. If you catch yourself comparing yourself to others, try to switch gears and think of one thing you genuinely like about yourself instead. And if you're feeling overwhelmed, remember that asking for support doesn't mean you're weak—it means you're brave. Reach out to someone you trust, whether it's a friend, family member, or teacher. They want to support you, and it's okay to lean on others. Most importantly, know that your worth is not defined by your achievements or what others think of you. You are more than enough simply by being who you are. Believe in yourself—you've got this!

Information for AP Students

Attention all AP students, create your CollegeBoard account and join your AP Google Classrooms if you haven't already! If you need help with your log on, please contact Mrs. Millette.

Guidance is now collecting the \$40 per exam non-refundable down payment for your Advanced Placement Exam(s). The deadline to make your deposit is **Friday, November 1st**. Payments of cash or check (made payable to ORRHS) will be accepted in the guidance office. If you miss this deadline, an additional \$40 per exam late fee will be added to your exam cost. The full cost per exam is \$99 with the exception of Seminar and Research, which is \$147 per exam. If you qualify for Free or Reduced lunch and would like to apply for a waiver, you must contact Guidance prior to Friday, November 1st, for approval. Students that are approved to receive a waiver will be responsible for a payment of \$50 per exam, with \$15 due by November 1st to avoid the \$40 per exam late fee.
