Spanish Curriculum Overview

Spanish I is an introduction to the Spanish language. The first portion of *Realidades Level 1* is the guiding curriculum used for this class. Students develop and practice listening, speaking, reading and writing skills. The customs and cultures of Spanish speaking countries are also explored.

Spanish II is a continuation of **Spanish I** in which students continue to learn and use the Spanish language. The remaining units in *Realidades Level 1* are the guiding curriculum used for this class. Students develop and practice listening, speaking, reading and writing skills. The customs and cultures of Spanish speaking countries are also explored.

Spanish III is a continuation of **Spanish II** and provides an opportunity for students to strengthen their skills in the Spanish language while learning new vocabulary and grammar. *Realidades Level 2* is the guiding curriculum used for this class. Students continue to develop and practice listening, speaking, reading and writing skills. The customs and cultures of Spanish speaking countries are also explored.
