# PAST Testing is October 11th with Early Arrival and Dismissal

#### PLEASE NOTE: School Start time on Friday, October 11 is 8:00am

All students in grades 7 - 11 take the PSAT at JPII. Not only does it provide the student and the school with data on how their learning is progressing, but it is also a good practice for taking the higher stakes S.A.T.

With the PSAT test quickly approaching on **Friday, October 11**, here is some important information for parents and students. **All students will be asked to report to school no later than 8:00am.** We will not have a late start next Friday. They will be instructed to go directly to their D Block class (high school) or 4th period class (middle school). Students in Grade 6 will report to the Commons and await departure for their field trip. Students in Grade 12 will not need to attend school. We ask seniors to use this valuable time to work on their college applications, service projects, catch up on assignments, or perhaps take a college visit since it is a long weekend. The dress code for the day is "House". High School non-standard test takers will be assigned to their respective rooms. Standard test takers represent the majority of our students. Non-standard test takers (high school only) are those students afforded additional accommodations from the College Board. We have notified non-standard test takers so if you have not heard from us assume your child is a standard test taker. All 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders are considered standard test takers.

We will have morning prayer and announcements then go into the testing period. All students will begin testing between 8:15-8:30. Testing time is 2 hours and 40 minutes, which includes a 10 minute break. This should have us ending standard testing between 11:00-11:20am. Parents should assume an 11:20 dismissal time. Busses will depart at 11:30. Non-standard test takers (high school only) will begin as soon as they can after morning announcements and parents will have to arrange for those students' transportation home. Testing should end for them at approximately 12:45. Students must bring their laptops FULLY CHARGED! If they do not have their computer, they cannot test. If students arrive after 8:15 they may not be able to test. Once the test has begun, we cannot admit students who are late.

Also, if you try to sign up for a conference with a teacher, and find that there are no more available spots, I'd encourage you to reach out to your child's teacher about that, as well, to discuss alternate meeting times. Both teams entered the matchup with perfect records, but when the final whistle blew, it was the Warriors standing tall, handing Pinewood Prep their first loss of the season and improving to an impressive 4-0. This highly anticipated showdown had all the makings of a classic.
