The School

Hollis Brookline High School is a four-year, public high school with a high level of academic rigor and outstanding school community resources. HBHS is accredited by the New Hampshire Department of Education and the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. HBHS was named the **#4** NH high school by **America's Best High Schools** and **#2 Manchester Area high school** in 2025 by *US News* and has been listed on *Newsweek's* list for over **fifteen** consecutive years. The standard coursework contains a rigorous college preparatory curriculum; the median GPA is greater than 3.5. HBHS has an enrollment of 728 students, a current senior class of 177, a Professional Staff of 94, and a Support Staff of 40. Hollis Brookline High School serves the towns of Hollis and Brookline with a combined population of 14,496. HBHS is located west of Nashua and borders Massachusetts. The community boasts large apple orchards, farms, specialty shops, and light industry. Professionals commute to Boston, MA as well as Manchester and Nashua, NH.

HBHS Curriculum

Hollis Brookline High School provides its students with an extensive and comprehensive curriculum, offering more than 165 courses in which the standard course consists of rigorous college preparatory coursework. Progressive work is available in the core subject areas. In grades 9 and 10, Accelerated classes are offered in English, Math, and Science; however, there is no additional weight awarded to the GPA. Honors and AP classes are offered to students in grades 10, 11, and 12, and additional weight is awarded toward the standard GPA. HBHS participates in the NH Scholars program. Students have the opportunity to participate in courses offered in regional technical programs at area high schools during their junior and senior years.

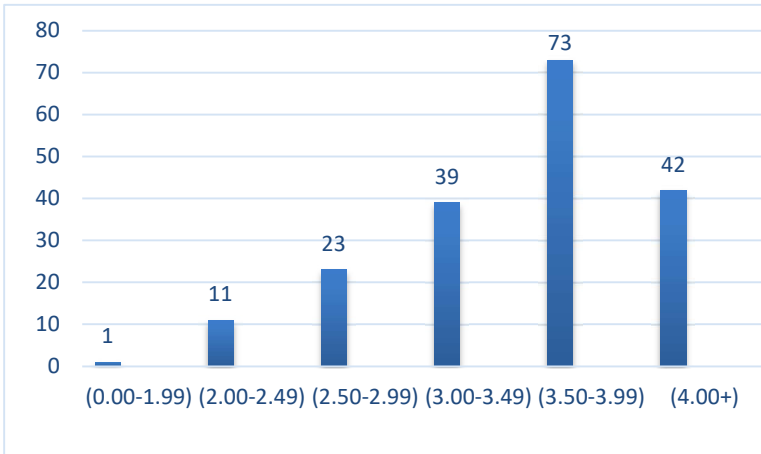

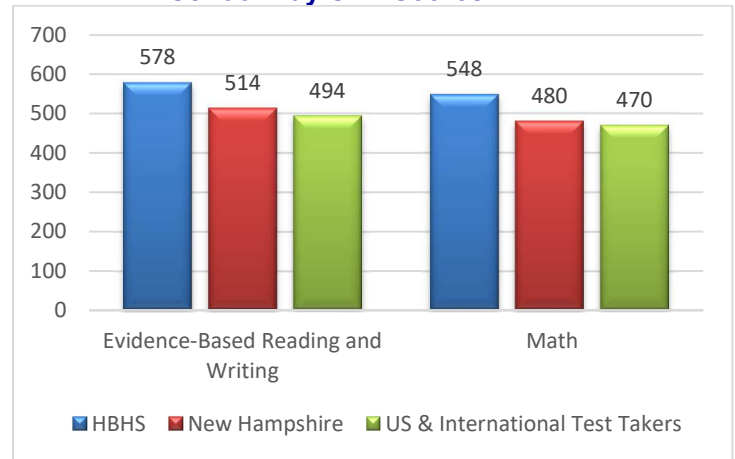

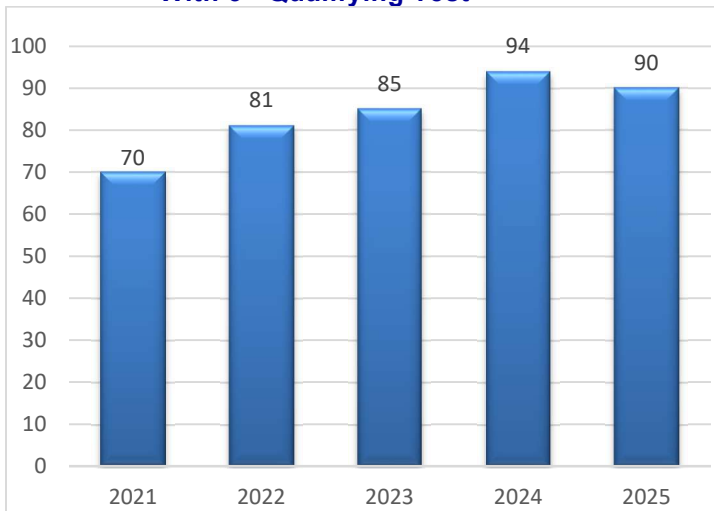
Distribution of Cumulative Senior GPA
