Senior And Junior Privileges At Hamilton

This week I got a chance to interview Mr. Arquiatt to ask him questions about upperclassmen privileges and I found out there are five different kinds of privileges. Privileges are you can come in late if you have a study hall first cell, or you can leave early if you have a study hall last cell (end of the day). If you have a study hall right before and or after lunch then you can extend your lunch period by the length of one period. If you have a study hall right before lunch you can leave ten minutes early from that study hall (This applies ONLY to study halls). New this year Seniors have the option to pick and paint their own parking spaces (spots in the student parking lot behind the bus garage.)

All Seniors have to earn privileges by getting parental permission, they must have a 75 or higher in all their classes, or be passing an AP class. They can't have discipline referrals. They have to sign out and sign in again when they return to the building. Finally, they also need to respect all members of the community while they are out.

Any privileges can get taken away as a consequence for not following the guidelines. The previous guidelines have to be met in order to keep their privileges.

Junior Privileges start at the first 10 week interval. They gradually earn them starting at the 10 week mark. Juniors vote on their privileges.

After the first 10 weeks they get one privilege, and after the second 10 weeks they get another, and by the end of the year they have the same privileges as the SENIORS. They can also be taken away for the same reasons.

In conclusion you have to be very thoughtful and careful to earn and keep privileges because anyone can lose them.

Rudy Giuliani Disbarred

Former US Associate Attorney General and Mayor of New York Rudy Giuliani has run into a lot of trouble after pursuing false claims on former president Donald Trump's behalf that the 2020 election was rigged. Back in 2020, he led a lawsuit in Pennsylvania attempting to overturn Biden's election win there, after which a review panel recommended that his license to practice law in Washington, DC be revoked for bringing his political biases into the courtroom. Last Thursday, September 26, he was, in fact, disbarred in Washington, after losing his license to practice in the state of New York just months prior.

Giuliani is facing much more serious problems than just losing his legal license, though. Two Georgia election officials have sued him for defamation and been awarded \$148 million in damages. In December, after hearing the verdict, he filed for bankruptcy, but his claim was denied this summer. As a result, last month, he was forced to turn over his NYC apartment and his prized New York Yankees merch collection in order to pay out the damages. On top of *that*, he's facing felony charges in both Arizona and Georgia for spreading false claims about the 2020 election results and attempting to overturn those results. He has pleaded "not guilty" to all charges on the grounds that he

genuinely believed the claims that he was making. An official verdict has still not been reached in these criminal cases.

Thirty were killed in one county after hurricane swamps North Carolina

On Thursday, September 26th Hurricane Helene tore across the state and caused bad flooding throughout Florida, North Carolina, etc. A more clearer view of this Hurricane went through Florida and Georgia throughout Sunday leading to a lot of flooding and debris all over through these towns and counties. The American Red Cross opened more than 140 shelters for those who needed to evacuate their homes in the southeastern states. On Sunday about 2000 people were using the shelters.

Helene began as a hurricane, the most powerful hurricane to hit Florida, and slowly moved to the north of Georgia, south and north Carolina and Tennessee. Most of the deaths had been confirmed in North and South Carolina where Helene landed as a tropical storm. On Sunday morning officials in North Carolina said "About 30 people had passed away in Buncombe County alone". Many people across the state are battling power and mobile service outages, many trees down, a lot of closed roads, and bad flooding.

NYC Mayor Indicted on Federal Charges

quite some time now. Several members, including Adams himself, had their phones seized over a year ago. Over that year, the FBI has slowly uncovered the net of corruption weaved by Adams and all of his old buddies from his police force days that he hired after he was elected.

Twin brothers Edward and James Caban served on the force under Adams, and Edward became his police commissioner when Adams became mayor. Meanwhile, James Caban opened a nightlife consulting business. After the investigations began, mayoral aide Ray Martin was publicly accused of extortion by a Brooklyn juice bar owner, who says Martin implied that the owner would have a friendlier relationship with the police if he hired James Caban as a consultant.

In another case, consultant Terrence Banks provided numerous companies with lucrative government contracts working with the city police and education departments - departments his two brothers, Philip and David, also old police buddies of Adams', now headed. He even set up a private meeting between one company and the schools chancellor.

Up until now, while members of Adams' administration were at the center of the corruption allegations, Adams himself was considered in the clear. However, on Thursday, September 26, Adams was indicted on federal charges because evidence had come to light that

he accepted campaign funds from the Turkish government. In the past he has, at their request, withheld statements condemning the Armenian genocide on Armenian Genocide Remembrance Day. He also pressured the NYC fire department to allow the opening of a highrise built to house the Turkish consulate despite the building not being up to code, seemingly in exchange for travel benefits from a Turkish airline. None of this was disclosed to the public.

Tropical Storm Helene

Greece Forest Fires fought by HUNDREDS

Greek firefighters have been battling a devastating forest fire for days, leaving two people dead and thousands of acres burned. The



Greek fire service said more than 400 firefighters, assisted by 20 aircraft, were engaged against the

blaze in the mountains of Corinthia in the Peloponnese region.

Government spokesperson claims that "Firetrucks had great difficulty approaching the blaze because of the narrow roads." This devastating fire, caused immediate help from Italian forces.

Greece, like other southern European countries, is plagued every summer by destructive wildfires that have been exacerbated by global warming. Over the past few months, the fire service has had to cope with more than 4,500 wildfires – which was said as the highest number ever recorded in a single fire season.

South Africa Shooting

Saturday September 28, 2024 there was a mass shooting, this shooting has taken 17 people living on the same street's lives. There were two homes that were targeted in this shooting, in the village of Ngobozana in Lusikisiki. In the first attack four people were shot and killed, with no survivors. The second attack there were nineteen people in two different houses, within the same yard. In this shooting there were thirteen people who got shot and killed. The total amount was fifteen women and two men killed.

The authorities have sent out a team of detectives and forensic experts to look over all of the evidence they have gathered to search for the

killers. Sadly mass shootings like these are common in South Africa, the country has also one of the world's highest murder rates. From police data for that 6,000 people have passed across the country from these shootings, between the months of April and June this year.

Natural News

With the effects of climate change scientists have been beginning to research new ways to help solve this crisis. A study found that a 3,375 year old tree could be the solution to these problems because trees are a natural way of disposing carbon emissions but when the trees die they release that carbon back into the atmosphere which is an issue for our current carbon crisis. But a new study analyzing a 3,375 year old eastern red cedar that was preserved in clay soil found that this tree lost less than 5 percent of its carbon dioxide emissions. Because the log was naturally entombed in a low permeability soil the fungi and oxygen were unable to reach its wooden exterior. This technique called wood vaulting is a tool that buries trees in low permeability clay soils so that



the soils can trap the green gasses. This technique could help the carbon emissions crisis and help make trees even more important and beneficial to our environment and

climate. Although this doesn't mean that it is important or helpful to bury logs in mass because these logs in forest are also important to those ecosystems. And although burying logs is not a substitute for the climate crisis it is another technique that we have to battle this climate crisis.

The Menendez Brothers: A Deep Dive into Netflix's New Series

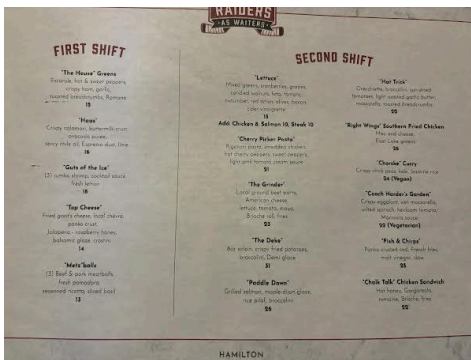
