- Review School Report Card
 - We have met a lot of the benchmarks that we set in our 5-year School Renewal Plan
 - Student achievement is strong; above the district average
 - Report card is available online on the SC Department of Education website
 - Science score is above the district average, but was a drop from previous year.
 - Question on why is math typically lower than reading and what is being done for that? Since the pandemic math scores have been lower; some foundational skills are missing. The district purchased an intervention program for math as well as extra funding for teachers to purchase manipulatives and other math resources. Math intervention is an area of focus too.
 - Multilingual Learners score is above district and state average (currently have 5 ML teachers working with approximately 180 students)

- As a school, we are looking to set rigorous goals so that we can show more of the achievement growth. Special education students are still expected to reach high expectations from a state level even though they have IEPs. We have begun implementing co-teaching in classrooms, and special education teachers are teaching modified lessons based on grade-level standards.
- Generate Ideas for School Improvement Council Focus for 2023-2024
 - School Garden science/math standards
 - Available to all grades
 - Could be an after-school club
 - Look at Lowe's Hardware for a Garden Grant
 - Do a penny drive to raise funds for it
 - Parent Volunteers in the cafeteria?
 - Possibly look at doing this during breakfast first consistency is very important to ensure coverage
