








Teacher Professional Development



Artificial Intelligence in Our Schools





Our teachers along with teachers from every school in the Archdiocese of Miami, recently attended a Professional Development workshop on Artificial Intelligence. The day started with a mass celebrated by Archbishop Wenski who was also joined by many priests from across the Archdiocese. The keynote speaker, Fr. Nathan Wills, focused on the use of Artificial Intelligence and the moral, ethical, and educational implications in Catholic Schools. Teachers learned about practical AI tools to help enhance their teaching as well as useful AI resources for students to utilize. It was an important workshop that helped teachers better understand how to navigate and work with this new technology.

4th Grade Activities






Mrs. Ibarra's 4th graders were tasked with creating Math board games. Each group had to design their own game, the rules to play, imagine different scenarios, and finally decide how players could win. In addition, students had to incorporate math problems and challenges as part of each game.









Balloon Engineering Project 4th graders also had a great time designing and building their own balloon

4th graders also had a great time designing and building their own balloon cars. It was a fun and engaging project that taught them some of the basic principles of science and engineering. Students observed how air escaping from the balloons propelled the cars forward. They learned the steps to use in the Engineering Design Process which included designing, building, testing, and improving their creations. They had three trials to test and solve any problems they encountered. This project encouraged critical thinking as students had to modify their designs to make their balloon cars go faster and farther.































Middle School Science



Carballo's Ms. 8th grade students conducted a science experiment to show signs of a chemical change. In the experiment, students mixed baking soda and opened a bottle of soda to witness the production of bubbles as a sign of a chemical change. The gas produced was trapped by the balloon. Students then worked building the chemical on equation for that change.
