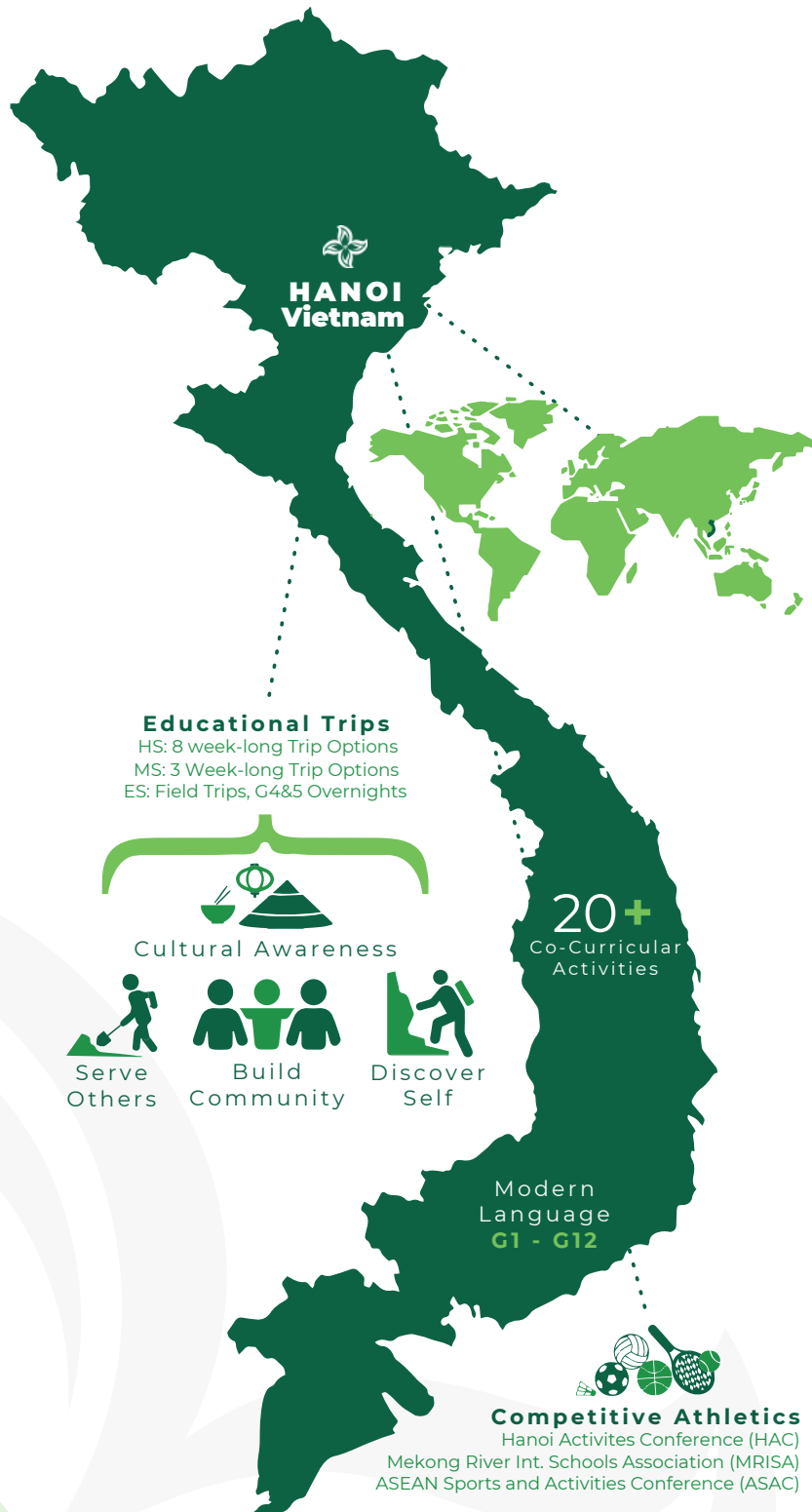




Our Philosophy

Academic Program

Concordia International School Hanoi offers a rigorous, college preparatory curriculum based on American standards and bench-marks. All instruction is in English with the exception of world languages. A few students may be assigned to Concordia's EAL program when their demonstrated English skills are one grade or below recommended grade level proficiency, and upon completion of the program they are then eligible to enroll in one of the World Language classes. In addition to classes taught on campus, students have the option to petition to enroll in online courses through Virtual High School. These classes are typically offered when there is a scheduling conflict, when a student is requesting a course that is not on offer in Concordia's curriculum, or when a student is striving to complete a graduation requirement.

Credits Required for Graduation

Graduation from Concordia (grades 9-12) requires the completion of the following high school course credits:

English	4 credits
Social Studies*	3 credits
Science	3 credits
Mathematics**	3 credits
World Language	2 credits
Fine Arts	2 credits
Wellness Credits	Participation every year enrolled. Includes physical education, social-emotional learning, and health.

* Students must complete one World History course

** Students must complete Algebra 2 as the minimum requirement for mathematics

Class Rank & Grading Scale

- Concordia does not report class rank.
- Concordia uses a 4.0 grading scale.
- Only coursework completed at Concordia is used in the calculation of a student's GPA.
- Concordia does not weight grades for AP, honors, or dual credit courses. Students who meet the prerequisites can take AP and/or dual credit classes.

Course Explanations

The range of course offerings available at Concordia International School has increased as the student population has grown. Please see the explanations below for further information on recent additions to our program.

MVLA (Multivariable Calculus and Linear Algebra)

A few exceptional mathematics students who complete the AP mathematics curriculum are eligible to take Multivariable Calculus and Linear Algebra, which are advanced math courses that extend beyond the scope of the AP curriculum and are offered as dual enrollment courses through online courses with a university partner.

Applied Learning Labs

Applied Learning Labs are unique and advanced learning opportunities provided to students who are interested in producing knowledge. These intensive learning opportunities are tailored to a particular discipline, where students may choose to produce research targeted toward submitting a conference paper or paper for journal publication, or develop and host an art show, direct a movie or play, produce a film, or other activities designed to contribute to the body of knowledge in a particular area of study.

Independent Research: Science/Social Sciences

This advanced research course is available to a select number of students who have demonstrated exceptional academic achievement in the sciences or social sciences and are interested in engaging in an intensive year long research project with a faculty mentor.

Wellness

The Concordia wellness program uses grade-level seminar classes to help students develop a healthy lifestyle, and strategies for coping with academic rigors and life challenges. The program encompasses the use of weekly wellness surveys to help track students mental health, in conjunction with classroom instruction regarding physical and emotional health, social skill development, university and career preparation, and life wellness components to facilitate the development of the whole student.

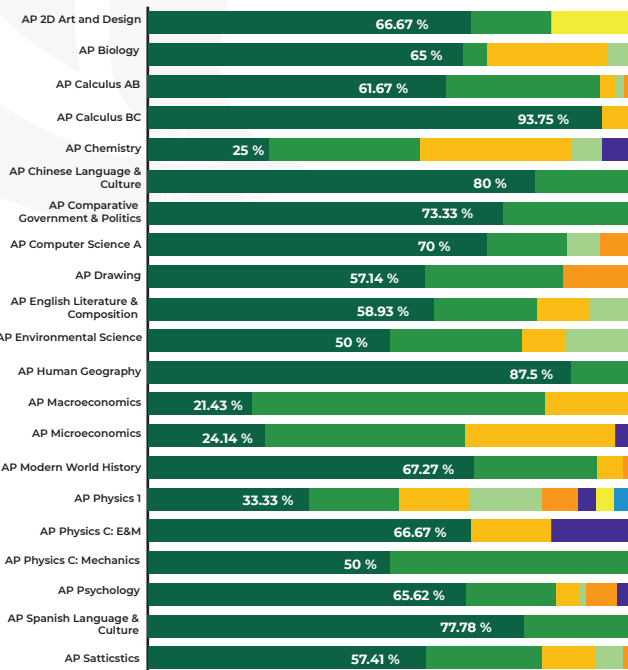
AP Courses

Students may take a maximum of eight total AP courses over four years. Current distribution across grade level is as follows:

97% of grade 10-12 students took at least one AP course in 2023-2024

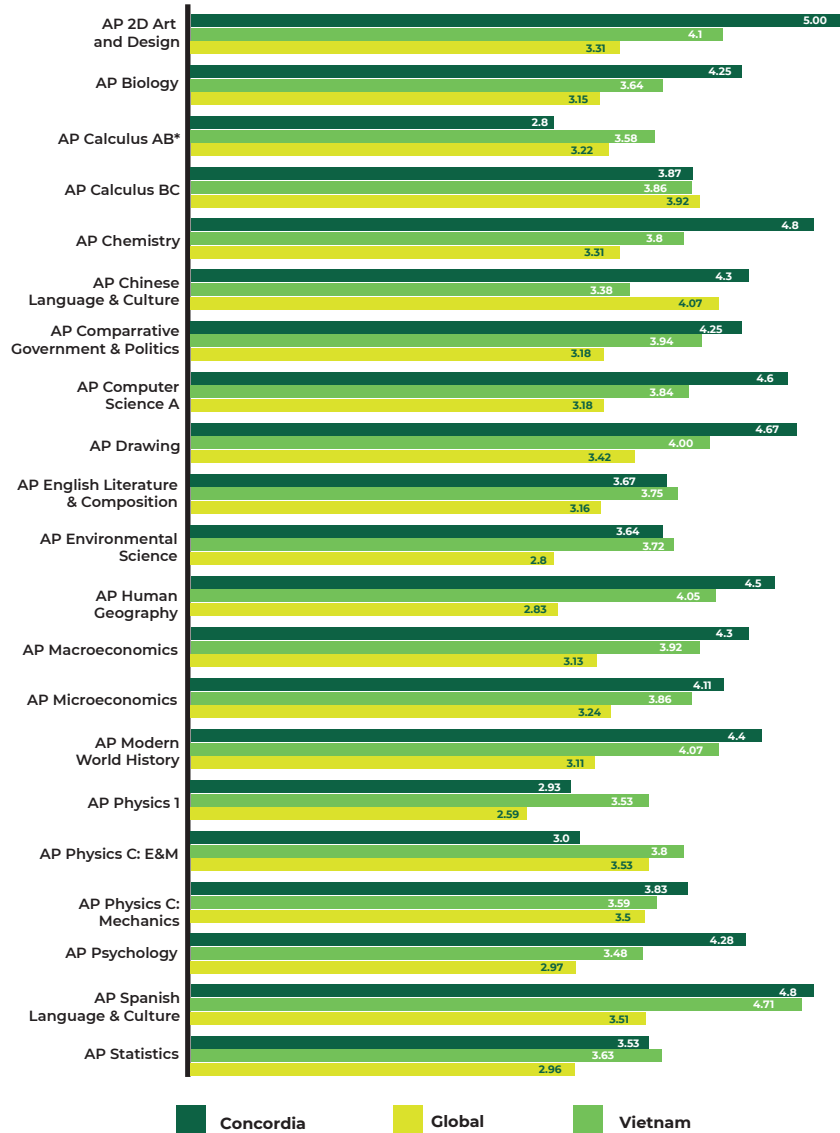
2023-2024 AP Grade Distribution

2024 AP Test Scores (Average)



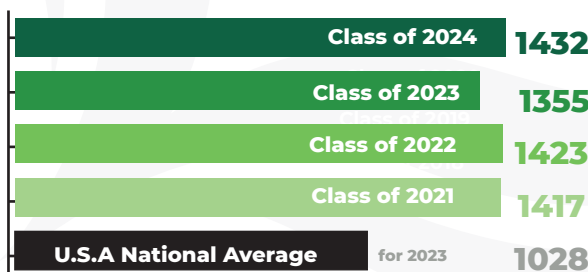

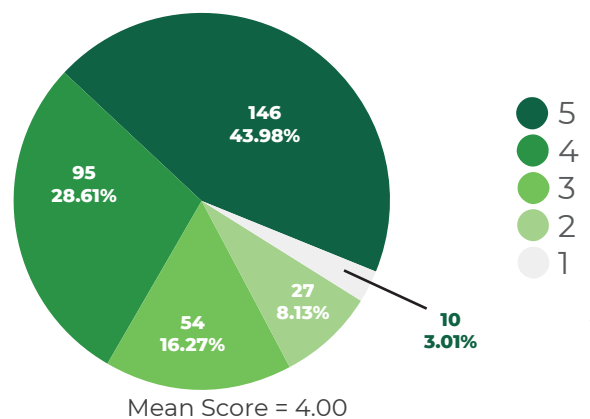
