



# WORK BASED *Learning*

The Work-Based Learning (WBL) program allows juniors and seniors who have an identified career objective to obtain experience and skills in a workplace setting. Co-op and Internship opportunities are available for all areas of study within the Career & Technology Education Department. Students may work in paid or unpaid positions.

- Earn up to 3 credit units per year for related class and work experience
- Attend regular classes in the morning and leave school early for 5th, 6th, and/or 7th periods
- Google Classroom monthly assignments turned in online
- Work a minimum of 5-15 hours per week depending on the number of periods
- Dual Enrollment students may use WBL periods to complete their schedule and are provided scheduling flexibility if needed. (eg., WBL during 1st/2nd).

- Good attendance and discipline
- Provide own transportation
- Pass 5 out of 6 classes previous semester
