ORIENTATION DAY Thursday, August 1, 7:30 AM to Noon

BEFORE ARRIVING: ACCESS YOUR MYeCLASS ACCOUNT

Returning students will need to reset their password, and new students will need to gain initial access. Use your Chromebook or MYeCLASS to manage your password and obtain your schedule.



The morning of Orientation Day: Follow the twopage instructions at tinyurl.com/eclassschedule or the QR code. Page 1 gives password instructions; page 2 gives steps to access your class schedule. Print the schedule or take a screenshot; you will need to refer to it to visit your assigned classrooms on Orientation Day.

DURING ORIENTATION

Stop by your classrooms for supply lists and other information. Pick up your locker assignment from your Guided Study teacher (if you rented a locker). Find bus routes and numbers in The Commons. Freshmen and students new to Brookwood may stop by the Media Center to check out a Chromebook.

NEW STUDENT WALK-THROUGH Saturday, August 3, 9 AM to Noon

A special welcome to freshmen and other students new to the

school: Bring your schedule to practice classroom transitions (peer leaders will assist). New students who did not check out a Chromebook at Orientation may stop by the Media Center to handle this before school starts.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL Monday, August 5

Students should bring their charged Chromebook and charger on the first day of school. Students new to Brookwood who have not yet picked up a Chromebook may go to the concession stand in The Commons during their assigned lunch to obtain one.

OPEN HOUSE PARENT NIGHT Thursday, August 15, 5:30 to 7:30 PM

Join us at this once-a-year opportunity to walk your student's schedule, classroom to classroom.

PARENT SQUARE AND PARENTVUE

ParentSquare is the school district's school-to-home communication tool. To activate an account or reset a password, go to ParentSquare.com and enter the phone number or email address that the school has on file. If you have questions, scan the QR code for tips and answers.



ParentVUE enables parents and guardians to see schedules, grades, assignments, and more. The email address the school has on file is also your ParentVUE username.



Get both apps at Google Play or the Apple App Store to easily access your student's information on your phone or other portable device.

NEED TO CHANGE YOUR ADDRESS?

Visit the Registrar webpage under the Counseling tab on the school website to download the change-of-address form. Forms are also located in the Counseling Office. Processing requires proof of residency; refer to the form for details.

PAPERWORK AND MYPAYMENTSPLUS

Beginning Monday July 15, visit MyPaymentsPlus to complete necessary back-to-school paperwork. To set up a free account, use your student's ID number. Fund cafeteria accounts, pay for lockers, club memberships, department and clinic contributions, and other areas of interest.





MEDICATIONS

Review guidelines on the school's clinic page for health management plans, medication, and forms. Scan the QR code for all clinic information.

SUMMER READING ASSIGNMENTS

Brookwood requires summer reading and assignments for all Language Arts courses, most AP courses, and Gifted Biology.

To review the list, scan the QR code or look on the school website under the Academics tab. Lists are separated by academic department. Advanced Placement (AP) courses are duplicated under their own dropdown section.



USING GCPS-ISSUED STUDENT EMAIL

Gwinnett County Public Schools (GCPS) issues email accounts to all students for school purposes. To activate and use an account, students must log in to eCLASS and click on Google Workspace for Education.

Students are required to use their GCPS email account when sending email communications to school staff members.

11[™] GRADE IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT

Students in 11th grade who are 16 years old must turn in an updated immunization form 3231 that is marked "Complete for 11th grade and higher" before school starts Forms may be brought to the main office during the summer.

IEP, 504, ELL ACCOMMODATIONS


Students with local school testing accommodations as required by their IEP, 504, or status as an ELL student are usually eligible for College Board testing accommodations (PSAT, SAT, or AP), but they must apply. Visit accommodations.collegeboard.org.

With the exception of ELL accommodations, accommodations approved by the College Board remain in effect with no need for annual renewal. Accommodations approved due to ELL status must be renewed on an annual basis. The deadline to request accommodations for the Fall PSAT/NMSQT is September 1.

CHROMEBOOK PROTOCOL FOR ALL STUDENTS

RETURNING 10TH-12TH GRADE STUDENTS

Students who kept their assigned Chromebook over the summer should fully charge and then power on their Chromebook before the first day of school. Restarting the Chromebook is necessary to ensure all updates are completed. Students should bring their charged Chromebook and charger with them on the first day of school.

9TH GRADERS AND STUDENTS NEWLY ENROLLED AT BROOKWOOD

These students may check out their Chromebook and charger at one of the following times:

- Orientation Day, Thursday, August 1, 7:30 AM 12 PM (Media Center)
- Freshman Walk-Through Day, Saturday, August 3, 9 AM –12 PM (Media Center)
- During assigned lunch, Monday, August 5 Friday, August 9 (The Commons Concession Stand)

Fully charge the new Chromebook at home the same evening and bring it and the charger to school the next day.


Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a framework for improving and integrating facets of student behavior and disciple that affect student outcomes every day. The data-based program is designed to improve social and academic outcomes, reduce exclusionary discipline practices, and enhance our school personnel's effectiveness. It is a way to support everyone–especially students with disabilities–to create the kind of school where all students are successful.

After a successful March to One Million (M1M) campaign to raise \$1 million for charity within 10 years, Brookwood surpassed its goal in February 2023 in less than nine years. A second round, M2M, began in Fall 2023 for another million for charity.

Brookwood has donated to many local and national organizations over the years, including Amanda Riley Foundation, American Cancer Society's Relay For Life, Boys & Girls Clubs of America, Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, and United Way.

TRAFFIC FLOW PATTERNS

To avoid extra traffic congestion at the intersection of Webb Gin House Road and Dogwood Road, Brookwood does not allow a westbound, left -hand turn from Dogwood Road into the school parking lot during school days 6-7:30 a.m. Please utilize the parent drop-off lanes along Dogwood Road located on each side of campus (see the green squares below). Only buses are permitted to use the horseshoe drive-way at the front of the school during morning arrivals and afternoon dismissals. On-campus student parking is located in the northwest part of campus; students should enter from either Hollybrook Road when driving north toward Dogwood Road, or from Webb Gin House Road when driving south into the main school entrance.
