Title I is a federally funded program that provides financial assistance to states and school districts to meet the needs of educationally at risk students. # School Wide Programming

1

Conducting a comprehensive needs assessment, examining the current status of the school and identifying the root cause of students not meeting standards.

2

Preparing a comprehensive school improvement plan to address the identified needs of the school.

3

Annually evaluating the implementation and results of the school wide plan and as needed, revising the plan.

# How are students selected for Title I Services?

- Children who are most in academic need (based on a variety of academic indicators, e.g. ILEARN, IREAD-3, NWEA MAP, NWEA MAP Reading Fluency) receive Title I services through RTI and/or Title I paraprofessionals.
- Student identification must include at least two criteria.
- Socioeconomic status is not a determining factor in student selection.

Free/Reduced % drives our funding - Academic need drives student services.

Parents of all children in all Title I schools have the right to request and receive timely information on the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teacher(s). This notice must be sent at the start of each school year and include:

## Parents' Right-to-Know

- If the teacher has met State certification and licencing requirements for the grade levels and subjects for which the teacher provides instruction.
- If State certification and licensing requirements have been waived for the teacher under emergency or other temporary status;
- If the teacher is teaching in the field or discipline for which they are certified or licensed; and
- If your child is receiving Title I or Special Education services from paraprofessionals, his or her qualifications.
