



17 Broncos Accepted to the 2024 Governor's Honors Program



April 12, 2024 (Snellville, Ga.)—More than 4,200 students statewide were nominated by their teachers to the 2024 Georgia Governor's Honors Program this year. Out of this selective tier, only 1,500 advanced to the interview and audition process after review of their application. Ultimately, about half were named finalist, including an impressive 17 from Brookwood High School.

The summer program involves all 700 or so students living in the dorms at Georgia Southern University and attending classes in their specific area of study. Each evening, they participate in a variety of social and instructional events.
