## About

Roswell High School, established in 1838, is a public school in the Fulton County School System. The Home of the Hornets sits on 54 acres in Roswell, Georgia, just north of Atlanta. We are proud of our rigorous academics, innovative STEM offerings, robust Career and Technical Education department, extensive fine arts programs and competitive athletic teams. Roswell’s student organizations are a vast melting pot of ideas and voices. Our greatest assets are our diverse student body of more than 2000 pupils, dedicated administration, teachers and staff, caring counselors, engaged families, loyal alumni, dedicated volunteers, supportive school district and our historic relationship with the city of Roswell.

## Mission

Roswell High School’s mission is to create a positive and safe learning environment, foster each student’s potential and provide pathways to success after graduation.

## Student Body

Our 2023-2024 enrollment of 2045 produced 495 graduates. Roswell’s graduation rate was 93.6%, exceeding the state of Georgia. 78% of the seniors attended 4yr colleges, 8% attended 2yr colleges and our strong CTAE programs developed technical skills of additional graduates for trade professions. 54% of the student body participated in 17 sports and 23% were active in performing arts and other extracurricular activities.

## Graduation Requirements

**Each school year** is divided into two, 18-week semesters. The fall semester ends in December and the spring semester concludes in May.

**Each semester** students take 6 courses to fulfill credits.

**Each course** is ½ credit except for Dual Enrollment courses which are awarded 1 credit per semester.

**Roswell does not use class rank except for the Valedictorian and Salutatorian.**

Weighted grades are used to calculate numeric average. Seven (7) points are added to the final passing grade of all AP, Honors, Dual Enrollment and Accelerated courses.

CCRPI Content Mastery for Fulton County Schools is 82%, and the state of Georgia is 65%.

## AP Courses

AP coursework is available for students in grades 9-12 with limited availability to grades 9 and 10. In 2024, 743 students took 1519 exams and 83.6% of students scored a 3 or higher on a 1-5 scale.
