  - Grant Overview- 2021-22 and upcoming 2022-23 allocations
    Please review the grant overview document that provides funding amounts and details on how Title 1, Title 2A, and Title IV grants were spent for the current school year. The document also provides details of ESSER, IDEA, state and local grants.
  - We have received our final 2021-22 allocations for the Title 1, 2A, and IV grants and working on finalizing the funds. We are anxiously awaiting for the 2022-23 grant allocations to be posted. Next year, Title funds will be spent similarly to this year.

• All ESSER grants have been approved by PDE. ESSER federal funds are to assist districts in preventing, preparing for, and responding to the COVID-19 pandemic. ESSER I's funding period will end on Sept. 30, 2022. ESSER II funding will end on Sept. 30, 2023, and all of the ESSER ARP funds, which includes 7% set aside grant for learning loss, summer and after school progams, and ARP homeless, will end on Sept. 30, 2024.

### • Title 1 Equity Plan

At last month's board meeting, the Title 1 Equity Plan was approved but to provide some information on the plan it is a Federal requirement that ensures the poor and minority students in Title I schools are not being taught at a disproportionate rate by teachers who are unqualified, inexperienced, or who are teaching out of the field.

Approval of Catasauqua Area School District Final Budget 2022-2023 (Proposed) The Board hereby adopts the attached draft budget as the proposed final budget for fiscal year 2022-2023, prepared by the Board of School directors in accordance with Section 687 of the Public School Code and in the form prescribed by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. The President of the Board is authorized and directed to make the certification to the Department of Education required by Section 687 (a)(1) of the Public School code. The Board may adopt the final budget for fiscal year 2022-2023 and the necessary appropriations measures to put it into effect no less than thirty (30) days hereafter, after making such revisions and changes to the proposed final budget as appear advisable, if any. The Board currently intends to adopt the final budget on Tuesday, June 14, 2022. As soon as practicable, and in no event less than twenty (20) days before adoption of the final budget, the School District shall print the proposed final budget (on the uniform form required by the Department of Education) or otherwise make it available for public inspection to all persons, and shall make it available for duplication to any person, on request. Public notice of the proposed final budget shall be given as soon as practicable, and in no event less than ten (10) days before adoption of the final budget. The proposed final budget estimates General Fund expenditures of \$38,960,414 for fiscal year 2022-2023, and balances anticipated revenues and expenditures with an anticipated real estate tax rate of 19.9477 mills in Lehigh County and 56.1601 mills in Northampton County.
