The Lehigh Carbon Community College Operational Budget for the fiscal year 2022-2023 is presented for approval. The total 2022-2023 Operating debt service and capital budgets are \$58,665,789 an increase of \$4,394,301 or 8.1% from prior year's revised budget. The Catasauqua Area School District sponsor share will be \$164,406, an increase of \$1,667 or 1.0% from last year's revised budget.

Approval is requested for the 2022-2023 Budget of the Lehigh Career & Technical Institute. The total 2022-2023 Operating Budget is \$29,779,840, an increase of \$803,740 or 2.77% increase. The Catasauqua Area School District share is \$910,902.32 an increase of \$92,520.70 or 11.3% increase. The proposed Academic Center Budget is \$2,164,100 an increase from previous year \$85,800 or 4.13% increase based on a projected enrollment of 400 total students at a cost of \$4,730.25 per student, an increase from prior year of \$195.50 The Catasauqua Area School District share of the Academic Center Budget is \$92,015 an increase of \$7,518.
