- A. Academics and Education Christina Lutz-Doemling
  Christina Lutz-Doemling- provided the Board with a brief overview of the Parent
  Guardian online 2020-2021 Survey and its closing; three (3) textbooks on the agenda for
  approval; and the Submission of the 2020-2021 CASD Flexible Instructional Day
  application and Instruction Exemplars also listed on tonight's agenda for approval.

  Robert J. Spengler-provided an overview of the Final approval of the 2020-2021Budget of
  \$33,576,329. Mr. Spengler also discussed the big change on the Revenue side is from
  Federal funds CARES Act and additional Revenue from the Health and Safety Grant.
  Mr. Spengler also discussed the Tax Millage and the annual rebalancing requirement
  because we are in a two (2) county school district, verified by Dave Knerr, the Lehigh
  County was approximately an 1.8% increase which equates to approximately a \$39.00 a
  year increase on taxpayers based on an average assessed home. Northampton County is a
  5.3% decrease, equating to approximately \$139.00 savings to taxpayers based on an
  average assessed home.

- E. Athletics-Thomas Moll
  - Mr. Spengler started off with an update on Athletics and the general template that will be used for the restart of Athletics in 2020-2021. Mr. Moll explained how the template was developed by information from our partners at Lehigh Valley Health Network, Coordinated Health, in conjunction with their medical doctors and their athletic trainers, and help from the Pennsylvania Department of Education and the CDC, and PIAA. Mr. Moll provided a brief overview on how the first two weeks will consist of conditioning and weight training. A wrestling room will be converted into another weight room area so we can have 10 to 12 kids in the wrestling area and 10 to 12 kids in the weight room area based off of the social distancing guidelines. Our athletic staff from LVHN will be there during all off season workouts as part of our agreement.
  - Mr. Dale Hein voiced his concerns, after Mr. Moll's overview, with approving an agreement that the board has not yet had time to review. Mr. Knerr indicated it was the Boards decision to hold off on approving the template until coaches were hired and had time to review. It was decided to approve the General Template at a Special Board Meeting to be scheduled the week of June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Mr. Moll also added the end of year awards are done and will get posted under our new school YouTube account.
