Approval is requested that the Catasauqua Area School District seek approval from the Pennsylvania Department of Education to increase the rate of the real property tax for the 2010-2011 fiscal year by an amount up to an additional 7.44 mills in Lehigh County and 7.44 mills in Northampton County over the rate for the 2009-2010 fiscal year pursuant to one or more of the following statutory exceptions to the general rule limiting tax increases to the applicable index (3.6%) under the Taxpayer Relief Act, Special Session Act. No. 1 of 2006, 53 Pa. Stat. Ann. § 6926.101 *et seq.* (the "Act"), and publish notice of intent to seek such approval on the School District's web site and in newspapers as required by law at least one week before submitting the request for such approval:

- (1) Exception under § 333(f)(2)(v) of the Act, 53 Pa. Stat. Ann. § 6926.333(f)(2)(v), relating to increases in expenditures on special education programs and services to students with disabilities from the 2007-2008 fiscal year to the 2008-2009 fiscal year by an amount greater than the current index (3.6%).
- (2) Exception under § 333(f)(2)(viii) of the Act, 53 Pa. Stat. Ann. § 6926.333(f)(2)(viii), relating to maintenance of selected revenue sources (including real estate and earned income taxes, and basic and special education funding allocations) where the percentage increase in such revenues from the 2007-2008 fiscal year to the 2008-2009 fiscal year is less than the current index (3.6%).
- (3) Exception under § 333(f)(2)(ix) of the Act, 53 Pa. Stat. Ann. § 6926.333(f)(2)(ix), relating to anticipated increases from the 2009-2010 fiscal year to the 2010-2011 fiscal year in costs for providing health care-related benefits which are directly attributable to a collective bargaining agreement in effect on January 1, 2006, by an amount greater than the current index (3.6%).
- (4) Exception under § 333(n) of the Act, 53 Pa. Stat. Ann. § 6926.333(n), relating to anticipated increases from the 2009-2010 fiscal year to the 2010-2011 fiscal year in the School District's share of payments to the Public School Employees' Retirement System by an amount greater than the current index (3.6%).
