

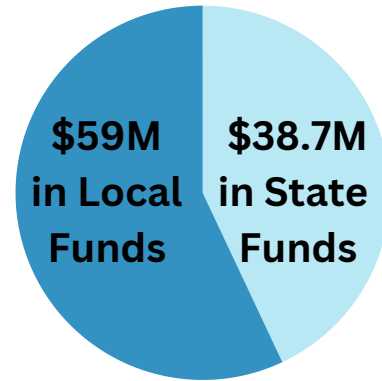

How will it be paid for?

Is this tax permanent like the ballot language says?

Not all of it. On the ballot is a combined bond issue and a tax levy for 1.4 mills. The bond issue for .94 mills is for 37 years. The tax levy for .46 mills is permanent.



1.4 Mills

\$49 a year
 or **\$4.08 a month**
 per \$100,000 of
 Appraised Value*

How much will it cost me? The cost per property owner is based on the property’s appraised value as assigned by the Clark County Auditor.

Current selling price is NOT the amount being taxed.

New Build vs Remodel

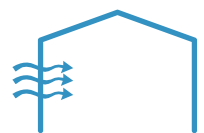
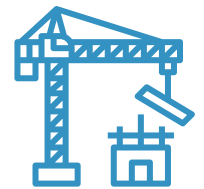
Why can't you add on or remodel?



Building architecture limits the ability to renovate and retrofit. 1960s T-beam architecture doesn't allow for building up or expanding internally.

Architecture of building lacks a building “envelope”.

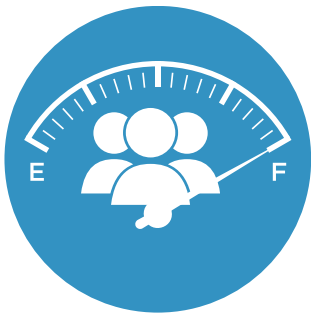
There is minimal separation between interior and exterior components. This makes moisture, temperature, and air control extremely challenging.

The Demand for Career-Tech



Career-tech education is in demand. Student enrollment is limited by undersized classrooms. CTC has turned away over 1,200 students over the past 11 years.

250 students for the current school year were turned away due to lack of space.



Classrooms Are Undersized

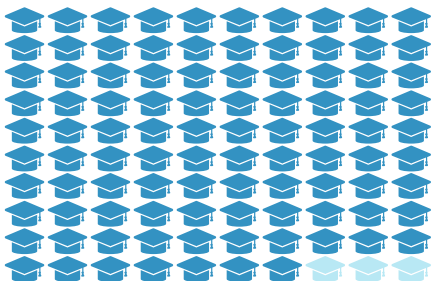
The average classroom is 550 square feet. The state standard is 900 square feet.



Classrooms Are Underequipped

Science classrooms lack gas lines for equipment and should have more emergency eyewash stations.
