CLASS TITLE: POOL MAINTENANCE WORKER

Range 50

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of an assigned supervisor, perform a variety of unskilled and semi-skilled maintenance duties at district swimming pools and other district property; operate, clean, repair and maintain swimming pools and all related equipment; assist other maintenance personnel with related duties as assigned.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

Perform a variety of duties and activities related to preventative maintenance and repairs of swimming pool equipment and the cleaning of the swimming pool and surrounding pool facilities.

Operate pool filters and pumps; clean swimming pool systems; test pool water and chemical content and balance; adjust chemicals as needed.

Perform routine repairs and adjustments to pumps, chlorination equipment relating to large commercial size swimming pools; identify and report needed repairs and maintenance problems.

Maintain cleanliness of pool office and surrounding pool related facilities; keep pool facilities clean; brush, skim, and vacuum pool; clean deck and deck tiles.

Order, receive, store, and maintain inventory of swimming pool chemicals, supplies and materials in a safe and orderly fashion.

Store, maintain and setup aquatics athletic equipment for special events as needed.

Maintain daily records pertaining to swimming pool and other related duties as assigned; use maintenance work order system.

Install, repair, troubleshoot, adjust and perform preventive maintenance on pumps, pump bearing assemblies, couplings, motor belts.

Use a variety of hand tools and power equipment; make minor mechanical repairs.

Operate a district vehicle.

Assist other maintenance personnel with related duties as assigned.

OTHER DUTIES:

Perform related duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES:

KNOWLEDGE OF:

Methods, techniques, supplies, materials and equipment; utilized in the cleaning, care and maintenance of a large commercial type swimming pool.

Methods, techniques and procedures used in maintaining and performing routine repairs to swimming pool related equipment.

Basic custodial cleaning methods.

Safe working methods and procedures.

Standard swimming pool safety and health precautions.

Basic record-keeping techniques.

Common tools and equipment used in pool maintenance activities.

Preventive maintenance principles and practices.

Basic tools, equipment, terms and practices used in pool maintenance and repair work.

ABILITY TO:

Sanitize, clean and maintain a commercial type swimming pool.

Prepare and maintain needed records and reports.

Make simple arithmetic calculations.

Develop and maintain cooperative working relationships.

Adjust work schedules to accommodate school aquatic activities. Prepare swimming pools for daily use.

Understand and follow oral and written instructions.

Perform heavy physical labor.

Operate a vehicle and a wide variety of power equipment and hand tools related to assignment.

Perform a variety of unskilled and skilled maintenance repairs related to assignment.

Observe health and safety regulations.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

Education: Graduation from high school or equivalent.

Experience: One year of experience involving the care and cleaning of a swimming pool. Six months of experience performing general maintenance of buildings is desired.

Any combination of training and/or experience which would likely provide the required knowledge and abilities may be considered.

LICENSES AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

Valid California Driver's License. Proof required.

WORKING CONDITIONS:

ENVIRONMENT:

Indoor and outdoor environment.

Seasonal heat and cold or adverse weather conditions. Regular exposure to fumes, dust, dirt, oil/grease.

Driving a vehicle to conduct work.

Subject to noise from equipment operation.

PHYSICAL ABILITIES:

Lifting, carrying, pushing or pulling heavy objects (up to 75 pounds)

Walking.

Reaching overhead, above the shoulders and horizontally.

Standing for extended periods of time.

Seeing to read meters.

Seeing to observe needed and completed repairs. Bending at the waist.

Kneeling or crouching.

Dexterity of hands and fingers to operate various equipment and tools. Climbing ladders and working from heights.

Walking over rough or uneven surfaces.

HAZARDS:

Fumes, gases and odors from paint, solvents and other chemicals including chlorine and acid. Working from heights on ladders and scaffolding.

Working in a cramped or restrictive work chamber. Working with and around electricity.
