FEDERAL IMPACT AID FORMS

Each year, D20 distributes Federal Impact Aid Forms to families. Beginning October 1, 2024, you may receive this light blue form from a teacher, administrator, or through parent/teacher conferences. The form must be completed and returned no later than **Thursday, October 31, 2024**. Because the information requested on this form can vitally affect the federal funding our district and schools receive, TCA strives for a 100% response rate. The survey must be completed even if it does not apply to your child (Box #4).

Please Confirm student information is correct.* Then complete the following steps, checking one of the boxes listed below. Sign, date, and return the form to your student's school:

- Box #1: <u>Active-Duty Member</u> of the Uniformed Services complete this box, sign, date, and return the form.
- Box #2: Foreign Military complete this box, sign, date, and return the form.

- Box #3: <u>Civilian Employed on Federal Property</u>, complete ALL fields in the box, sign, date, and return the form. *Note: The name of the company and the physical address of your place of employment are required. You must write in the street address, even if it's on base.*
- Box #4: If you are **not military affiliated**, check box 4, sign, date, and return the form.

*Incorrect Home Address on the Form?

TCA cannot change your address in D20's Infinite Campus system. In order to update your address with D20, please complete a <u>D20 Change of Address Form</u> and return it to the campus office manager or to the TCA Registrar's Office. The completed form will be sent to D20 Central Registry, who will update your record.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Junior High Parent-Student Teacher Conferences

Thursday, October 10th from 12:00 Noon to 7:00 PM and Friday, October 11th from 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM

Conferences are held in the TCA North Secondary Commons (Cafe)

Dear Parents.

We are looking forward to you meeting with your child's teachers at our Parent- Child - Teacher Conferences in about two weeks. **We encourage all students to attend conferences with their parents**. Personal responsibility and ownership of their academic success is very important during

the junior high years and beyond. As you prepare for conferences, the following procedures and scheduling information will help maximize the value.

Thursday and Friday Conferences: Arena Style Conference in-person meetings

To afford parents and their child the opportunity to meet with up to nine teachers, secondary conferences are conducted using the "arena" system rather than scheduling individual conferences as is the practice in our elementary schools. This means all teachers are available to all parents at all times during the conference sessions*. Parents do not sign up for conferences in advance. Junior High teachers will be located in the Student Commons / Secondary Café by the main entrance, so you can meet with them on a drop-in basis. As we cannot predict when the heaviest traffic will be, it is impossible to precisely estimate how much time you will need. It is reasonable to budget 15-20 minutes per teacher for both waiting time and a conference. Usually, you can gauge the line for each teacher and adjust accordingly to maximize your conference time and minimize your waiting time.

*Teachers who are unable to attend some or all of our pre-established conference times may notify their students and families of alternate conference dates and times.

THE CONFERENCE: What to Expect:

Teachers will share a little about your child's academic success and involvement in their class. They will often ask some questions of your child (if they are attending with you) or you to get to know them better. This is a great time for you to share something we would not otherwise know about (IE: they love the subject, they are nervous about being called on, they struggle with tests, ...). Typically ending the conference with any questions you or your child might have about the class, their assignments, or their assessments. Conferences typically take about five minutes, but teachers will need to end the conference after ten minutes to make sure that there is enough time for all our families to meet with them.

I have included a link to the Infinite Campus Parent Portal below for you to prepare for the conferences. Infinite Campus is a great resource throughout the year to keep up on your child's homework completion, grades, and attendance. Throughout the school year you can call or email your child's teacher when you have a question or concern.
