IN AN EMERGENCY TAKE ACTION

HOLD! In your room or area. Clear the halls. INSTRUCTORS AND STAFF

Close and lock the door Account for students, visitors and others Do business as usual

SECURE! Get inside. Lock outside doors. INSTRUCTORS AND STAFF

Bring everyone indoors Lock outside doors Increase situational awareness Account for students, visitors and others Do business as usual

LOCKDOWN! Locks, lights, out of sight. INSTRUCTORS AND STAFF

Recover people from hallway if possible Close and lock the door Turn out the lights Move away from sight Maintain silence Do not open the door Prepare to evade or defend

EVACUATE! (A location may be specified) INSTRUCTORS AND STAFF

Lead evacuation to specified location Account for students, visitors and others Notify if missing, extra or injured people

SHELTER! Hazard and safety strategy. INSTRUCTORS AND STAFF

Evacuate to shelter area Seal the room Get to high ground




