Principal's Message

September was School Attendance Awareness month. Thank you for your efforts in ensuring your students had every opportunity to learn by making sure they were at school. Last year one-quarter of our students were classified with Chronic Absenteeism. This is an improvement from the previous year when one-third of our students were Chronically Absent. For a student to be classified as Chronically Absent they are absent from school more than 10% of the time. With a 180 day school year, that means they were absent more than 18 days, which is basically an entire month of academic school days. In other words, one-quarter of our students missed more than a month of school last year. The staff of Colonial Heights is extremely dedicated and work very hard to provide students with their missed work when they are absent. Most students complete that work but, one thing the pandemic taught us is that students learn best when they are face-to-face, live, with their teacher. Even if students are doing the make-up work when they are absent they are not learning as much as they could or should if they were actually at school. If your child is sick and running a fever please keep them home, but if they are not, send them to school. We want all of our kids to reach their highest potential and that starts with being in school.

Some Safety Tips from Officer Raikes

Don't forget, Lincoln offers a Fee-Based, Full Day Preschool.

Our program operates on the Lincoln Annex campus (2020 West Swain Road), Monday through Friday from 7:30am to 5pm.

The cost is a flat rate of \$30 per day, billed monthly, following Lincoln Unified's school calendar for the year.

To enroll in our fee-based, full day preschool program, your child must be toilet trained, 3 or 4 years old (priority to children who are 4 years old or will turn 4 by Sept 1st), live within Lincoln Unified school district boundaries or have a family member employed with Lincoln Unified.

Step 1: Add your preschooler to our current waitlist https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSevmdxNGIHmhAJgxMQqx8B-pr4xRr6eXZNHsIQZDOC-ynSnvA/viewform.

Step 2: ECE Staff will call families to schedule an enrollment appointment from our waitlist in priority order. Enrollment appointments will take place at the Early Childhood Education Office (2016 Paloma Ave). Once you have an appointment, ECE Staff will provide you an enrollment packet to complete and bring, along with all other required documents, to your enrollment appointment.

Updated Cell Phone Policy for 2024-25 School Year

We would like to follow up on recently announced changes to our cell phone policy for the 2024-25 school year. As stated in a letter sent home to parents and guardians, students will not be able to use their cell phones during instructional time. Students will be required to place their phones in an identified space in their classrooms, and their phones will need to be turned off.

We want to reiterate that students will place their own cell phones in an assigned area inside their classroom at the start of each class period or school day, and personally retrieve them when their class period or school day is over. At our high school campuses, students will have access to their phones during passing periods and at lunch.

In the case of an emergency at school, it is common to want to reach your student or have them contact you with updates. However, we want to prevent the spread

of false or incomplete information during a crisis situation, and first responders and law enforcement recommend that we do whatever we can to keep this from happening. With this in mind, we will relay emergency information to parents and guardians as quickly as possible through ParentSquare. Each school in our district also has an administrative office phone that students may use to contact their families.
