



## "High School Credit" Means?

- <u>MATH:</u> Algebra 1 & Advanced Geometry
- <u>World Language:</u> Traditional Classroom: Spanish & French Virtual: German & Latin



- Final grades and credits/verified credits are recorded on student's high school transcript (GPA)
- High school curriculum = more rigorous; requires consistent, daily effort for success
- An opportunity if/when students are ready--- not a race







#### **World Language Screening Process**

When students have completed level 1 of World Language and wish to move onto level II, teachers will make a recommendation based on a minimum, consistent 80% (assessments).

### High School Credit Course Considerations

- Closely monitor progress early on early establishment of effective routines
- It's all about consistent effort and the response to being challenged:

"When the going gets tough, how does the student respond?"

## **YCSD Honors Program**

#### 8<sup>th</sup> Graders are eligible to participate if:

- Advanced English 8
- Algebra I or higher level math

\*All high school students complete either an Advanced or Standard Diploma

#### To continue in high school:

- 4 consecutive years of World Language
- Minimum GPA (3.25 9th/3.50 10<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup>); No report card grade below a "C"
- 20 hours of community service during high school
- Minimum of 6 AP courses in 4 content areas during high school





#### 1:1 Device Program

Students can use their own device or check-out a YCSD issued device

#### Aspen

Students' schedules, list of teachers, monitor students' official grades, attendance information, emergency contact information

#### Office 365

Cloud based version of Microsoft Office suite – outlook email for students, word, excel, PowerPoint, etc.

#### **Canvas LMS**

Students can see all their class content in one place, including a calendar for due dates, links to class resources like videos, and posted homework assignments. They can turn in assignments and see teacher feedback. Parents can "observe" their student's progress and performance in each class. (Other YCSD parents have suggested parents use the student Canvas app to monitor student progress).
