

Funding Challenges: Why Our Buildings Are in Such Need of Repair

The lack of funding for the Cherry Hill Public Schools has been a challenge for decades. WE have seen improvements and continue to push for what is rightfully ours.

It's a question that comes up regularly in our community: Why are our school buildings in such need of repair when our taxes are so high? The short answer: a lack of our fair share of funding from the state. We have been underfunded by more than \$150 million over the past decade. Our district has a decades-long history of being underfunded that can be traced to the 1980s, even after the passage of the <u>School Funding Reform Act (SFRA)</u> of 2008 receiving as little as 40 percent of what we were entitled to in recent years. Since the 1990s, CHPS administration after administration was left with the challenge of how to allocate our very small amount of state funds to continue the excellent education we offer. Year after year, staffing and programs took top priority. Maintenance "must-do" projects were completed. We garnered grants such as a Regular Operating District (ROD) Grant for replacing the original boilers in all 19 of our schools. But other maintenance that could be put off, was put off. Our facilities suffered the consequences, as have the students and staff making do in less-than-ideal environments. After years of CHPS administrators and Board of Education members lobbying our State Representatives and the Governor of New Jersey, we were advised in 2014 that any successful efforts to obtain fair funding would have to come from community constituents. By 2015, the Zone PTA Fair Funding for Cherry Hill Schools Committee was formed.

The Fair Funding Committee has helped us make strides toward securing fair funding for our district. Their tireless work has helped keep us consistently "on the radar" of our representatives, of NJ Senator Stephen Sweeney, and of Governor Murphy. Since 2015, we have seen funding increase by \$5.5 million. It's a step in the right direction, for which we are grateful, but from which we have not become complacent. It's now budget season in

Sweeney in a letter I sent him on February 10</u> that this still falls far short of the \$29 million we are entitled to receive under the <u>SFRA</u>, and that we expect him and our state lawmakers to continue the increases promised us under the <u>recent S-2 legislation</u>.

The Fair Funding Committee continues their work toward holding these decision makers to their financial promises as well. Attend the monthly Fair Funding meeting, generally on the fourth Thursday of the month at 7 pm in the Malberg Administration Building, if you can. And tell your fellow community members what's happening, and how they can help.

We will keep you posted on the amount of funds we are allocated from the state this year, and we will continue to press for the regular increases we have been promised.

Kindergarten Registration Dates Set

Dates and instructions for registering kindergarten and 1st grade students new to the Cherry Hill Public Schools for the 2020-2021 school year are now available online.

Students must be five years old on or before October 1, 2020 in order to be eligible for kindergarten.
