Kindergarten Registration Dates Set

<u>Dates and instructions for</u> <u>registering kindergarten and</u> Congratulations to Horace Mann and Thomas Paine Elementary Schools and Cherry Hill High School West for their designation as 2020 New Jersey Schools of Character!

Character.org, a national advocate and leader for character in schools, families, sports teams, and the workplace On January 31 designated 81 schools and 7 districts as State Schools of Character for 2020.

Criteria for selection are based on Character.org's 11 Principles of Character which include providing students with opportunities for moral action, fostering shared leadership, and engaging families and communities as partners in the character-building effort.

Current 5th grade families: If you would like to submit an application for Open Enrollment to Rosa international Middle School for the 2020-2021 school year, please view the Open Enrollment Letter online.

Applications will be accepted from February 18 through February 28, 2020. You must submit your application by 4 pm on February 28, 2020. The online application will not be available after 4 pm on February 28, 2020.

1st grade students new to the Cherry Hill Public Schools for the 2020-2021 school year are now available online.

Students must be five years old on or before October 1, 2020 in order to be eligible for kindergarten. Students currently enrolled in the Cherry Hill Public Schools (including the Barclay Early Childhood Center) do not need to re-register.
