HOW ABOUT AN ALTERNATIVE TO "HOW WAS YOUR DAY?" HERE ARE THREE MORE IDEAS: (CREDIT TO @BIGJOURNALLIFE)

"What is one thing you wish you could do over or do differently?"

This helps your child practice reflecting on their behavior and **mentally rehearsing** a different response.

"What was the coolest thing you learned today?"

It gives your child an opportunity to teach you something (a great confidence boost!)

"Can you think of something kind you noticed today?"

This question promotes **empathy** and **emotional intelligence**.

REMINDERS

- As we have previously shared, all reporting of absences are entered using Attendance Monitor within PowerSchool. In order to use this feature families need to log into PowerSchool > Select the child for whom you need to report an absence > Click Attendance Monitor from the menu on the left > choose Report New Attendance. For additional information please refer to the email that was previously sent.
- All early dismissals or bus changes must be entered into School Dismissal Manager (SDM) by the cut-off time: 1:45 p.m. on regular dismissal days, 10:30 a.m. on early release days
- When entering a student as a guest rider in SDM you MUST include the name of the student they are riding /getting off the bus with.
- When entering a student in SDM for an Afterschool Continuing Ed class, you MUST include the name of the Continuing Ed class that the student is attending.
