Your continued support of DVUSD is more important than ever this school year as our governing board has called for a

Maintenance & Override Renewal and a \$325 million Bond on your ballots on November 5. Two-thirds of the bond funds help with the maintenance of district schools and buildings including: roofing, carpeting, A/C units, fencing, constructing new buildings to meet the needs

of our growing school populations, and more. If passed, there will be no increase to a taxpayer in our community. The override is a continuation of the same initiative that has been in place since 1991. These initiatives help to provide our students with the very best education and opportunities within DVUSD.

The quality of our schools also benefits our community as schooling options are one of the most important factors when considering a home purchase. Strong schools prepare future generations to be community contributors and having a reputable public school near your home is proven to boost the overall home value, reduce crime in the area, and strengthen community connection.

DVUSD Growth Projections

Just drive down any road within the DVUSD boundaries, then drive down that same road again a few weeks later, and you can see for yourself the incredible growth in the area! Our area will continue to grow, especially after the recent announcement of funding for a third TSMC microchip plant off 43rd Avenue and the 303. TSMC's first chip plant is expected to open in 2025, the second in 2028, and the third by 2030.



Phoenix has always been a popular destination for new arrivals, but how big will the population boom in our area be over the next several years?

A study commissioned for DVUSD in 2022 by Applied Economics, LLC, shows our neighborhood will likely be very different by 2032:

Potential housing supply additions in the District are estimated at over 14,000 units. The amount of activity forecast in the 2-to-5-year period and beyond indicates a substantial escalation in expected production.

- Elementary attendance area enrollment during the first five-year period (2022-27) is forecast to increase by four percent, or 700 students, including the addition of 200 out-of-District students. The largest enrollment increases are expected in the Union Park (560 students), Sonoran Foothills (340 students) and Esperanza (300 students) attendance areas; five additional attendance areas are expected to increase enrollment by more than 12 percent in the next five years (2022-2027).
- Significant growth in the Barry Goldwater attendance area is anticipated throughout the projection period, resulting in the addition of nearly 1,500 students (a 62 percent increase) by 2031-32; in addition, more than 200 out-of-District students are expected to be added over the next 10 years.
- Depending on market conditions, total enrollment for DVUSD is forecast to bring in anywhere from 35,500 students to 38,000 students by the 2031-32 school year.






The DVUSD Difference

- DVUSD spent 72.4% of its FY23 budget on classroom spending, a category of spending that includes instruction, student support, and instructor support. This is comparable to similar "very large" unified school districts in Arizona, and is a 1.6% year-over-year increase from FY22.
- DVUSD has 23 schools that have earned the coveted "A+ School of Excellence" designation by the Arizona Educational Foundation (AEF), including three of the AEF's 37 awards in 2024.
- DVUSD's 4-year graduation rate ending in June 2024 was
 94.6%—17.1 percentage points higher than the state average.
- DVUSD's percentage of students that passed state assessments in FY 2023 exceeds the state average by 17 points in math, 16 points in English Language Arts (ELA), and 20 points in science.

Spinach Stuffed Shells

INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 package jumbo pasta shells or cannelloni pasta
- 1 Tablespoon salt
- 1 Tablespoon oil
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 cups fresh spinach
- legg beaten
- 1 1/2 cup ricotta cheese

- 1 cup mozzarella cheese, divided
- ½ cup parmesan cheese, divided
- 1 teaspoon dried parsley
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon black pepper
- 1 ¼ cup marinara sauce

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- 2. Fill pot of water halfway and add salt. Bring to a boil.
- 3. Add pasta and cook for 8 to 10 minutes or until al dente; drain in a colander.
- 4. In a non-stick pan heat oil on medium heat, add garlic and spinach. Cook for 3-4 minutes. Spinach should be bright green and wilted.
- 5. In a large bowl, mix egg, ricotta, half the mozzarella, half the parmesan, add cooked spinach, parsley, salt and pepper until well combined. Use a spoon to stuff cooked shells/cannelloni pasta with ricotta-spinach mixture.
- 6. Pour 1/4 cup marinara sauce into baking pan to coat just the bottom. Add stuffed shells/pasta. Pour remaining marinara sauce on top of stuffed shells/cannelloni and top with remaining mozzarella and parmesan cheeses.
- 7. Bake in preheated oven 20 minutes, until edges are bubbly and shells are slightly set.
