

Highlights from the April 2017 Action Meeting

Presentations

Members of the Rosa International Middle School MATHCOUNTS team were recognized for their win at the South Jersey Regional Competition.

Board Representative Reports

Cherry Hill High School East Representative Kaitlyn Boyle reported on the Thespian Society's trip to Europe and the French exchange trip. She also noted that the Habitat for Humanity Club traveled to Birmingham, AL, to help build houses, work on landscaping and take time for social "bonding" activities as well. Ms. Boyle mentioned the Baseball Team's Spring Break trip to Myrtle Beach. She added that members of the Robotics Team would be competing in the World Competition in Louisville, KY. DECA Nationals were coming up for 48 East students in Anaheim, CA, she said. Ms. Boyle also detailed the success of two students going to the INTEL Science Fair. She noted that the Mr. East competition was coming up, as well as Mental Health Week. Ms. Boyle announced the Earth Day issue of Eastside would be live online on Friday, April 21. She noted the following upcoming events: Junior Prom and the spring Band and Orchestra concerts. Ms. Boyle said the seniors expressed mixed opinions about the activities offered to them during PARCC testing. Some suggested for next year to have bonding activities. Ms. Boyle noted that many seniors are committing to colleges. She will be going to the University of Pennsylvania and East's Alternate Student Representative Ezra Nugiel will be going to Middlebury College.
