

GOVERNING BOARD MEETING MINUTES – March 6, 2024

A. Meeting Opening – 7:00 PM

Call to Order

Mr. Montero called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Roll Call

Board Members present: Armando Montero (President), Sarah James (Vice President), Amanda Steele, Andres Barraza, and Berdetta Hodge.

Adoption of the Agenda

On motion of Mr. Montero, seconded by Mrs. James and passed 4-0 (Mr. Montero: aye; Mrs. James: aye; Mrs. Steele: aye; Ms. Hodge: aye; Mr. Barraza not present at the time of voting) the Governing Board approved the meeting agenda.

B. Executive Session

The Governing Board did not meet in Executive Session.

C. Reconvene

Welcome—Mr. Montero welcomed everyone.

<u>Pledge of Allegiance/Moment of Silence</u>—Mrs. James led the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a moment of silence.

<u>Land Acknowledgement</u>—Ms. Hodge read a statement acknowledging Tempe Union's presence on the ancestral lands of the Akimel O'odham and Pee Posh Indigenous peoples.

D. Report from Acting Superintendent

D-1—2024 Tempe Diablos Excellence in Education Award Finalists

• Dr. Wilson said every spring, the Tempe Diablos honor educators through their "Excellence in Education" awards. The final award winners will be announced at the Excellence in Education awards event on May 2nd. Dr. Wilson recognized nominated teachers, staff members, and administrators:

D-2—Desert Vista Speech & Debate Team

• Dr. Wilson recognized the Desert Vista Speech and Debate team for a phenomenal season and 19th state championship win. Coach Marco Dominguez said he is really proud of the students and acknowledged Mr. Montero who was a former Desert Vista speech and debate team member. Mr. Montero said he was on the team for three years and it was an invaluable experience that helped him get to where he is today.

E. Public Comment

- Ava Sanders, student, spoke on her experience in Desert Vista's choir and cautioned that cutting back choir offerings could prevent students from feeder schools and their desire to attend Desert Vista.
- Mela Miechle, student, said she is in Level III choir and it's a devastating thought to cut choir classes. Ms. Miechle said she has had chances to bond and grow with other students and thanked the involvement of all choir supporters including parents, teachers, and the boosters club, who she feels are more like family.
- Melodie Hartman, student, said cutting choir makes students less rounded and that choir improves cognitive abilities. Ms. Hartman spoke of the amazing teachers and trips she's participated in.
- Robert Matysiak, student, said he is a fourth year choir student and the district doesn't understand how
 choir affects him, saying it's his life. Mr. Matysiak said Ms. Flores provides wonderful direction and that if
 the thought was to have orchestra teachers lead choir they would only vaguely understand what is needed.
- Cassidy Trembath, student, said that choir is her safe space.
- Felicia Trembath, parent, asked that the board consider some things more important than money, like mental health. Ms. Trembath said that COVID-19 took away true experiences from students, and that if the district cuts programs they cut opportunities.
- Lisa Thomas, parent, said we are currently experiencing a mental health crisis and that choir provides a safe feeling of togetherness, and keeps her daughter engaged in school. Ms. Thomas said the Ahwatukee community values the arts.
- Jody Hernandez, parent, said its been three months since the December special education meeting and that she is asking once again for another meeting. Ms. Hernandez said most parents who come to speak at the board meetings weren't invited to participate on the special education committee and that there are rumors circulating about an increase in resignations from special education staff. Ms. Hernandez said she also wants to know why her son's grades have changed from performance indicators like "satisfactory" to percentages.
- Dani Thomas, student, is a second year Desert Vista choir student who said she's gained lots of new knowledge, met amazing role models, and gained a family. Ms. Thomas said her mental health has also improved as a result of choir.
- Leah Perez, student, said cutting choir from five sections to two may not seem like a lot, but that it's a big decrease to students. Ms. Perez said she's heard staff members saying that this is uncanny compared to other schools. Ms. Perez said she met her best friends while in the program and that choir is a safe place for students.
- Morgan Philpot, student, said she was reading the words "Excellence in Teaching and Learning" written
 across the dais and feels the district's actions do not reflect that statement. Ms. Philbot said Mr. Montero
 shared his own experience as a member of speech and debate, acknowledging how important these
 programs are.
- McKenna Philpot, student, said choir teachers and parents are very supportive of the program and that there are many opportunities that come along from being in choir, like jobs and scholarships, and that by cutting sections there will be reduced opportunities.
- Amiyah Powell, student, said she's been in choir for two years and has been able to find herself.
- Monica Gallman, parent, spoke on equity and said that all positions are not equitable, suggesting the district employ creativity in discussing how to retain choir offerings. Ms. Gallman also said choir and fine arts programs are important for mental health.
- Abigail Gellman, community member, said she is a former district graduate and is thriving at Arizona State University due to Desert Vista choir, and that less choir means less opportunities.
- Natalie Henderson, student, said choir is the one place she found friends and bonds that will last a lifetime and who are more like a family. Ms. Henderson said cutting from five to two sections will not provide the same opportunities.
- Jennifer Jarvis, parent, said her son sang at Unified Sports Day earlier in the day, and that the love and support from the choir students was amazing. Ms. Jarvis said the district should leave no stone unturned suggesting brainstorming sessions and also requested to be kept in the loop on future decisions regarding cuts to choir sections, saying open communication empowers the community.
- Julie Kent, parent, said two years ago her son called her from a school bathroom, whispering that a peer had shown him a gun. Ms. Kent advocated for better safeguards and opportunities for discussions surrounding gun violence in our schools.

- Nicole Wintring, parent, said she is against the district cutting 7th hour speech and debate because it would mean a decline in enrollment of students in the program. Ms. Wintring said she wants to be part of a solution and requested Principal White include her in a committee regarding long term budget decisions.
- Cora Wintring, student, said she is the president of the speech and debate team and that cuts made to the 7th hour would mean a decline in recruitment, and that currently 7th hour provides honors credit. Ms. Wintring said that cutting a section would cut opportunities for students and that without a 7th hour they would not be able to win future state championships since the model is all based off a number game.
