STEM for All

STEM education is vital to the Cherry Hill Public Schools community. WE are carrying out our commitment to STEM at every grade level, beginning in kindergarten!

You no doubt have heard of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) education and its importance in proving a strong academic foundation for all students. Interestingly, the word "stem" in the English language refers to the main part of a plant that supports its other parts, such as leaves or fruit, and also is the term for the part of the brain that controls the flow of messages between the brain and the rest of the body. So no matter the context – as an acronym, or as a word – STEM/stem is foundational. I take great joy in seeing the evidence of our district's commitment to STEM every time I visit our schools. STEM in action at every grade level is thrilling to witness! From outdoor weather observations and predictions in kindergarten to building and attempting to stop a "landslide" made from household items in second grade, as pictured above, our youngest students embrace the fun of STEM learning. And just yesterday, middle schoolers at Carusi discussed how to design a cup to keep hot chocolate warm on a cold day. At the high school level, physics students will, in a couple of months, embark on building "spaghetti bridges" using only dry spaghetti and glue – an engineering challenge to be sure!

I had the great pleasure today of visiting the robotics room at Cherry Hill High School East to hear about the latest accomplishments of the Vex Robotics Club – now composed of approximately 100 students with a passion for STEM! The Rev. Ivan George Essay/Poster/Video Contest for Black History Month 2020 is now accepting entries from all Cherry Hill Public School students K-12. This year's topic is "African Americans in the Armed Forces and NASA." Entry deadline is February 1, 2020.

Three monetary prizes will be awarded at each grade level: K-1st; 2nd-3rd; 4th-5th; 6th-7th; 8th-9th; 10th-11th; and 12th.

This year's Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemorative, the New Jersey MLK Commission, will focus on the women leaders of the struggle for equality and civil rights.

Students: You are invited to join this movement by creating an essay that will tell the story of Women Who Led, and how they can inspire you and all of us! Choose one of the 10 great leaders listed online and write an essay about what you find compelling about your choice. The Commission seeks essays from middle and high school students, as well as youth engaged in various programs.

- The deadline has been extended: Applications must be submitted online by December 18, 2019.
- Notification of the essay honorees (a total of 10) will be sent by January 6, 2020.

Those selected will receive:

- A medal of Recognition;
- A \$100 gift card;
- Essay will be posted on our website;
- Honorees will be asked to read their essay at the MLK Commemorative on January 19, 2020, at the State Museum Auditorium in Trenton, N.J.
