Multi-grade-level Mentoring

Our older and younger students enjoy many opportunities to work together, embodying the "WE" in #WEareCHPS.

It's been an exciting week in the Cherry Hill Public Schools, as we've celebrated Veterans Day, World Kindness Day/Cardigan Day, the official recognition of Joseph D. Sharp Elementary School as a National Blue Ribbon School, and two mornings devoted to many of our elementary and middle school students going to see their peers perform in preview showings of *Matilda the* Musical at Cherry Hill High School West. It is an absolute thrill for me to experience excellence district wide, giving us cause to celebrate! Most exciting of all is watching the ever-growing opportunities for students in multiple grade levels to work together and learn from one another. *Matilda the Musical*, for example, features elementary, middle and high school student actors (shown above in rehearsal) from across the district focusing their talents to produce a stellar show in a matter of weeks. The younger actors are mentored by the older actors, while the older students gain an appreciation for the contagion of joy, energy and wonder that young students bring to any activity. Other examples of multi-grade-level mentoring across CHPS include:

- The Bridge Program of tutoring and mentoring between Cherry Hill High School East students and students at Rosa International Middle School
- West Broadcast's collaboration with Clara Barton Elementary 5th graders to create Barton's own broadcast news program
- Sports team mentoring in which a variety of our high school teams work with their middle school counterparts and township recreation leagues during occasional practice sessions
- Our West and East Robotics Teams mentoring students in our middle school robotics programs

in Cultural Proficiency and Equity Workshops

On Thursday, November 14, 2019, 35 teachers and principals from all 12 of our elementary schools participated in the second of six workshops on Cultural Proficiency & Equity.

This lesson focused on the many Barriers to Cultural Proficiency. Teams are being led by Dr. Barbara Moore Williams, the district's Cultural Proficiency & Equity consultant. Since October, school teams use professional learning time to share what was learned with their respective faculties.

This work is linked to the Board of Education goal of closing achievement gaps where they exist. Secondary teams will meet with Dr. Williams on November 26. All 19 building teams will work with Dr. Williams six times over the course of the 2019-2020 school year.
