## Election Day 2019 has brought familiar and new faces to the Cherry Hill Board of Education table.

Fulfilling the position of Board of Education member is a tremendous commitment and gift to the community. Two incumbent candidates were elected in yesterday's election: Mrs. Ruth Schultz won the 2-year, unexpired term seat; Mr. Benjamin Ovadia, who filled the seat vacated by former Board member David Rossi, won a 3year term.
