As **WE** look back on the 2019 Week of Respect, we reflect on how to make every week a reason to celebrate how we treat one another.

Beginning the first Monday of October every year, the state of New Jersey celebrates the Week of Respect in our schools. I'm always delighted to see first-hand how our schools celebrate the concept of Respect, which is also one of the three pillars of Character Education – Respect, Responsibility and Citizenship – that we strive for every day in the Cherry Hill Public Schools.

Our principals, teachers, guidance counselors and support staff work hard to facilitate age-appropriate activities and instruction focused on character building and bullying prevention during the Week of Respect. There were so many wonderful examples of this work in all 19 of our schools last week and this week, and I'd like to share a few:

- Students at A. Russell Knight Elementary created a project with the theme "Be a rainbow in someone else's cloud." The students showed respect to someone who is a "rainbow" to them by writing or drawing their reasons on a heart that is a color of the rainbow, as pictured above. Two examples: "My Mom and Dad are my rainbow because they are always there for me," and "Rosa Parks is my rainbow because she stood up for herself."
- Cherry Hill High School East Lab Theatre students staged preview performances of *The Bully Plays* at Carusi, Beck and Rosa Middle Schools this week in advance of their public performance at Cherry Hill East at 7:30 pm tonight. The middle school students were treated to snippets from the anthology of 24 ten-minute plays designed to challenge, inspire and enlighten audiences to help them confront the issue of bullying in a constructive and creative way. - Cherry Hill High School West Football Coach Bryan Wright tweeted on October 12: So proud of our program!
