Speaking Up, Staying Safe

Student Voice is about the children in our schools being heard – and that extends beyond daily classroom academics.

Busy days make for short days, and it seems every day in September has certainly been busy – suddenly, the month is coming to a close! As we approach a 4-day weekend and the month of October, I would like to offer a reminder to our families about the importance of our collective efforts to follow the "if you see something, say something" credo.

As superintendent, I am passionate about our students being heard – what I refer to as "student voice." District wide, our staff and administration are dedicated to encouraging our students to share their ideas, concerns and opinions in a respectful way. We are equally dedicated to listening to our students and responding in appropriate, constructive ways to what they are saying as we help to nurture their voices in a respectful and productive manner. This commitment to student voice applies not only to classroom learning, but to social connections, extracurricular activities and our paramount concern: the safety of our students and staff.

Every school year, students at all grade levels come forward with concerns about something they've seen, heard or experienced that they believe may compromise their own safety or the safety of others. We remind our students – and hope parents are reminding them as well – that whenever they see or experience something unsettling or concerning, they should immediately report it to a trusted adult. Our staff are trained in how to handle such reports, immediately. Certain concerns may be handled and resolved by staff; others may rise to the level of a report by our Campus Police and some may go directly to the Cherry Hill Police, who then take over the management of information communicated about the incident.

Elementary Named 2019 National Blue Ribbon School

Congratulations to Joseph D. Sharp Elementary School for being named a National Blue Ribbon School for 2019 by U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos. The recognition is based on a school's overall academic performance or progress in closing achievement gaps among student subgroups.

The coveted National Blue Ribbon Schools award, this year awarded to 362 schools nationwide, affirms the hard work of educators, families and communities in creating safe and welcoming schools where students master challenging and engaging content.

"We are thrilled to be recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School," said Sharp Elementary Principal Mr. Ric Miscioscia. "This speaks to the tremendous talent and commitment of our staff, the enthusiasm of our students, and the support from our Sharp families."

Sharp will hold a school-wide celebration in the coming weeks. On November 14 and 15, Secretary DeVos and the Department of Education will celebrate with the 312 public and 50 non-public school honorees at an awards ceremony in Washington, D.C.



CHPS Wins First Place Award in NJ School Public Relations Association Competition

The Cherry Hill Public Schools earned a First Place award at the New Jersey Public Relations Association's School Communications Awards on September 26, 2019 in the category of Social Media.

The 2019 contest was the most competitive on record with 64 submissions from 34 different school districts. The submissions were judged by a panel of 11 judges including professors from Rowan University and other industry experts across the country.
