Applications for the 2019-2020 Free and Reduced Price Lunch Program are available at www.payschoolscentral.com

PaySchools Central is a secure payment system that simplifies school payments in an easy-to-use online portal. It enable parents to fund lunch accounts and pay required and optional fees quickly and easily. More information about PaySchools Central is available online. Also available is a step-by-step guide to signing up for PaySchools Central. Note that an application must be submitted each year.

Families already receiving Free and Reduced Price Lunch benefits must reapply by October 15. If an application is not submitted by October 15th and your child currently receives benefits, your child's status will change to full pay breakfast and lunch. were notified that the

All money leftover in your MySchoolBucks account will automatically transfer to your new PaySchools account when you register on PaySchools Central.
