This is a year of many changes, all around the District. WE are happy to answer your questions about what's happening.

The 2019-2020 school year has already proven to be a time of change in the Cherry Hill Public Schools, even just two weeks into the school year. I am a believer that change in the name of progress and improvement is a good thing, in needed and natural occurrences. The changes we've been making around the District all summer and into the fall have been changes for the greater good: our launch of full day kindergarten, our continuing work to improve safety and security, the interior building improvements and exterior cleanup efforts all are essential to meeting the needs of our students and staff – not only the academic needs, but the needs for healthy and safe environments in which to learn and thrive.

As anyone who has experienced maintaining any sort of home knows, certain projects and changes require things to look worse before they look and function better. This week, some of our community members expressed concern regarding the condition of the Memorial Garden at Cherry Hill High School West. In this instance, I was able to inform the larger community via <u>a statement regarding</u> the restoration of the garden. Applications for the 2019-2020 Free and Reduced Price Lunch Program are available at <u>www.payschoolscentral.com</u>

PaySchools Central is a secure payment system that simplifies school payments in an easyto-use online portal. It enable parents to fund lunch accounts and pay required and optional fees quickly and easily. <u>More information about PaySchools</u> <u>Central is available online</u>. Also available is <u>a step-by-step</u> <u>guide to signing up for</u> <u>PaySchools Central</u>. Note that an application must be submitted **each year**.

Families already receiving Free and Reduced Price Lunch benefits must reapply by October 15. If an application is not submitted by October 15th and your child currently receives benefits, your child's status will change to full pay breakfast and lunch.

On August 19, 2019, parents were notified that the MySchoolBucks meal payment system is being replaced by PaySchools Central beginning this school year.

All money leftover in your MySchoolBucks account will automatically transfer to your new PaySchools account when you register on PaySchools Central.
