WE unveiled two exciting completed construction projects this week, celebrating the progress in improving our safety and security District wide.

In this season of celebrations, it was my great pleasure this week to join the amazing groups of people who helped major improvements to two of our school buildings come to fruition. On Tuesday, June 11, the administration, staff and students at Thomas Paine Elementary welcomed me and many guests from the community, including members of the Cherry Hill Police and Fire Departments, members of the architecture and engineering teams we contract with, and members of our own District administration and Board of Education, to the ribbon cutting that officially opened the new entry/security suite constructed at the school. This project, and a similar one completed at Woodcrest Elementary School, has been years in the making. It was wonderful to be able to thank in person so many of the folks who were instrumental in the completion of the construction. These two buildings each now possess a light and bright entrance with swipe card locks, a secure entryway/office suite for quest management, sensor alerts for propped doors, an interior/exterior school-wide camera system, and exterior blue strobe-light lockdown notification!

Free Summer Meals Available to Qualifying Students/Families

ATTENTION STUDENTS, PARENTS AND GUARDIANS: The United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Summer Food Service Program provides free meals when school is out! Who is eligible:

- Children 18 years of age or younger who come to an approved open site or a site to which they are enrolled.
- Adults over the age of 18 years who are enrolled in school programs for persons with disabilities.
- At sites that require enrollment, benefits are available only to children who receive free or reduced-price meals at school.

Organized by the Zone PTA Character Education Committee in conjunction with the District Cultural Proficiency/Equity/Character Education Committee, "Together WE Eat" fulfilled a need for food during spring, when donations typically diminish post-Thanksgiving and winter holidays, according to Cherry Hill Food Pantry Executive Director Janet Giordano.
