Bond Rebuild

WE are moving forward – with renewed interest and input from the community – to put together a new bond to fund our facilities' critically important needs.

A highlight of this first full week back to school after our winter break was the convening of our new Board of Education at its Work Session on January 8, 2019. The CHPS administration and the Board of Education are rolling up our sleeves and getting to work on the formulation of a new bond. This first round of Board conversation can be viewed on <u>our YouTube Channel</u>, where videos of previous Board meetings are archived.

As most of you know, the District put up for vote on December 11, 2018 a three-part Bond Referendum which did not pass. Bonds, for those who do not know, are a way for school districts to raise money - which they then must pay back over a period of years typically to finance building projects or other capital projects. Although we and the administrators, Board of Education members, and concerned citizens of the community before us have vigorously sought the funding we are owed from the state for decades, and will continue to do so, our lack of state funding has forced us to make tough choices. We have chosen to maintain small classes, important programs and quality staff. What little money has been left, even after using grant funding, has not been enough to fully cover our needed facilities improvements. We continue to fight to secure our fair share of funding, but even when we finally receive the \$29 million we should annually, our needs will far exceed those funds.

The community has let us know that they want to be more involved in the formation of the next Bond and that they are ready to share their voices and their

- Holding Town Hall Meetings devoted to community input about the Bond
- Appointing an ad hoc Bond Committee, comprised of a representative group of community members
- Determining an election date for the Bond, likely in the fall of 2020

Our **Bond web page** is still live and linked from not only the District web site, but from each school web site as well. There you will find a synopsis of the situation with the failed bond, as well as all of the background information about it. The page will be continually updated as we move forward with new plans. Developing a bond for our buildings is a long and detailed process.
