Bond 2018: Building a Solid Future

The Board of Education on October 2 approved the three proposals for the bond referendum special election on December 11, 2018. Here's what that means.

Happy October! I am pleased to report that the Board of Education at a Special Action Meeting on October 2 approved the three proposals ("questions") that comprise the bond referendum, which will be up for vote in a special election on December 11, 2018. The bond referendum's development began more than 10 years ago with discussion about issues with our facilities. After two years of community surveys and conversations, Strategic Planning Committee work, architectural, engineering and security analyses, and an exhaustive financial planning process, the bond has come to fruition!

We have a link on the District web site, in the center of the home page, which takes you to a plethora of information about the bond, including details about the projects planned for each of our schools. For those who weren't around or are too young to remember the last CHPS bond referendum in 1999, I'd like to explain what a bond is. Bonds are a way for school districts to raise money – which they then must pay back over a period of years – typically to finance building projects or other capital projects. We are putting this bond up for vote now because in 2019, CHPS will be debt free, making this the ideal

When you visit the Bond 2018 page, among other information you'll see a link to our Tax Impact Calculator. You'll be able to enter the assessed value of your home and see the estimated tax impact from the passage of Question 1, the passage of Question 1 and 2, and the passage of Questions 1, 2 and 3. From the beginning, we knew Question 1 would not raise property taxes. As you'll see on the Tax Impact Calculator, the passage of Question 1 actually will result in tax savings to property owners.
