# Moving Forward with Innovation

New and exciting initiatives are both here and on the horizon as WE finish out the school year.

There is a natural tendency, with graduation ceremonies and the final day of school less than a week away, to consider these last few days of the school year as a finale – to exhale with a grateful sigh and a sense of accomplishment. And while we certainly can celebrate all WE have accomplished, I'd like to point out the innovations that are taking place right now. These are initiatives that will have a great impact on the 2018-2019 school year and beyond!

First is the technology initiative in which all of our teachers have been given Chromebooks and are receiving training on using them. This is the beginning of our initiative to boost technology availability and use among our students. It became clear earlier this year that, as we endeavored to put Chromebooks in the hands of more students, our efforts needed to start with our teachers. In order for our students to learn effectively using new technology, our teachers would first need a firm grasp of the technology to be used. Our technology team is now in the final phase of distribution and training, wrapping up with the final two schools on their calendar: High Schools East and West. The response from our teachers across the district has been universally positive, and we are excited to see this technology put to use during summer professional development and then in our classrooms in the fall.
