Community involvement and input are key factors in

UPCOMING EVENTS the success of the Cherry Hill Public Schools. It's important to understand the framework through which one can become involved, as well as how decisions ultimately are made.

As discussion continues regarding recent events – both local and national – initial decisions have been made and the first of many actions taken regarding security in our schools. More community members than ever in recent memory have attended Board of Education (BOE) meetings and Coffee & Conversation meetings, and have emailed and called to voice their opinions, their concerns and their support.

One common refrain in all of this is: Are people being heard? I can answer that question with an unequivocal "Yes." Everyone who brings concerns to the Board and/or administration is heard. Although protocol at all Board of Education meetings is to allow public comment, not Q&A, our Board members and administrators listen intently to those who speak. Detailed notes are taken and every Work Session and Action Meeting is <u>live streamed</u> and later archived on our YouTube channel. We welcome the public to these and our BOE committee meetings, also open to the public and listed on our District Events Calendar, with the exception of our Human Resources Committee. Agendas for all meetings are posted in advance. And a great FAQ document about how the Board operates is available on the District web site, as are Board member bios, the BOE goals, and policies for review.

Some community members who never before attended a Board of Education meeting have expressed frustration at not receiving responses from the Board during Public Comment. To allow for dialogue about safety and security, we have scheduled three evening Community Conversations, all at 7 pm, on March 15 at Beck Middle School, on March 20 at Carusi Middle School, and on March 28 at Rosa Middle School. I hope you will attend one or more.

In all areas of our schools – safety and security, curriculum, policies and procedures, student codes of conduct, human resources matters, parent involvement – decisions and changes are made after

East Jazz Band Wins Multiple Honors

Congratulations to the Cherry Hill High School East Jazz Band, pictured above, who took home multiple honors from the Jazz @ Lincoln Center Essentially Ellington Regional competition on March 6 at Temple University.

As one of 21 competing bands from around the Northeastern U.S., East took home awards for best rhythm section, a \$500 scholarship for junior Ben Kornak as "Outstanding Soloist" on drums, and honorable mention for Elizabeth Bishop on bass. The selective competition gives four section and three solo scholarship awards.

The contest sponsors also recommended East Jazz Band submit recordings to the national level Jazz @ Lincoln Center competition next season.

The PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) assessment schedule is now set. Assessments will begin Tuesday, April 17, 2018 with high school testing. Middle school testing will begin Tuesday, April 24, and elementary school testing will begin Thursday, May 3.
