The athletics program in the Cherry Hill Public Schools has produced many regional and state champion athletes in many sports over the years – some teams have earned championships time and again. Regardless of their record, I believe every sports team delivers invaluable lessons to the students involved, including the team managers and even the spectators. Through sports, our students learn the rewards of hard work and dedication; how to be gracious losers and winners; how to mentor and learn from others; and how we are all capable of more than we realize.

As parents, it can be difficult to watch our children struggle, to watch them fail, without rushing in to "rescue" them. But listen to any athletes talk about how they achieved mastery or even greatness in their sport, and they will mention struggle and failure. I had the great privilege yesterday of attending a discussion with Isabelle Brasseur, the Canadian 1992 and 1994 Olympic bronze medalist pairs skater, who spoke with French students at Cherry Hill High School West. Ms. Brasseur, pictured above, spoke in both French and English about the work – since age 7 – that went into her Olympic achievements. She also spoke of learning English at age 18, and her determination to earn a college degree, which took eight years as she studied and competed at the Olympic level simultaneously. Her story is truly inspirational! And watching our current U.S. athletes competing in this year's Olympics is astounding as well, whether they are gold medalists the same age as some of our students, or great comeback stories as "old" athletes in their 30s!

The PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) assessment schedule is now set. Assessments will begin Tuesday, April 17, 2018 with high school testing. Middle school testing will begin Tuesday, April 24, and elementary school testing will begin Thursday, May 3.
