CHPS 2020 Plan Update

We've been out and about since August, speaking with community members about our long-range strategic plan. Here's the latest information about what's coming up next.

This has been an exciting year in the Cherry Hill Public Schools, not only because of how our students continue to learn and thrive with the outstanding guidance of our teachers and staff, but because we have been moving ahead with our long-range strategic plan, "Cherry Hill Public Schools 2020: A clear vision for the future."

We've added 26 community meetings to our communications efforts this year. Called "Coffee and Conversation with the Superintendent," (although some folks have nicknamed them "A cup of Joe, with Joe!") these meetings are taking in place in each of our elementary, middle and high schools, as well as at the Malberg Administration Building, on Saturday mornings, Sunday afternoons and weekday afternoons and evenings. The next meeting is on Saturday, January 6 from 9-10:30 am, and I welcome all members of the Cherry Hill community to join me at A.Russell Knight Elementary School. During these meetings, I detail the work that has been completed recently in our school buildings. We've finished dozens and dozens of capital projects during the last few years, and attendees of the meetings have expressed appreciation for being able to see pictures of that work, while gaining an understanding of how much work we have ahead of us.

In addition to the Coffee & Conversation meetings, we've been giving presentations at Board of Education meetings and Board Committee meetings on the progress of the 2020 plan and the implications for our upcoming bond referendum, which will take place in a special election on October 2, 2018. The bond is necessary for us complete projects that will help CHPS serve the needs of our students, as we continue to deliver the excellent education for which we are so well known. Reminder about Inclement Weather Decisions

CHPS has a comprehensive plan for determining whether schools should be closed or on a delayed opening schedule during inclement weather.

The decision to open or close schools in bad weather is based on a careful analysis of all relevant factors, including:

Road conditions throughout our large district.

Amount of accumulated snow and ice and whether precipitation is expected to continue.

Building conditions (e.g., do we have electricity and heat?).

Parking lot and sidewalk conditions.
