# Looking Inside, Offering Insight

As you learn more about your children's days at school, we'd like to you to use that knowledge as a catalyst for asking questions and offering suggestions.

Today wraps up the month of September. It is the eighteenth day of school, meaning 10 percent of the school year is now complete! In this short period of time, our students have already learned a great deal. And if you're a parent or guardian who has attended one or more Back-to-School Nights – which will wrap up on October 13 – you, too, have looked inside your child's school and have learned a great deal about the workings of your child's day, with whom he or she comes in contact, what the learning environment is like, and why certain teachers and/or classes have already earned "favorite" status.

Even if your school's Back to School Night has yet to take place, or if you are unable to attend and will rely on your school's Back-to-School-Night packet to garner information, you will soon have significant insight into your child's experience in the Cherry Hill Public Schools. I hope you will share that insight with me at one of my upcoming Community Conversations, the next of which is Saturday, October 14 from 9-10:30 am at Bret Harte Elementary School.

The Community Conversations began on August 26, as pictured above, as a series of Saturday morning meetings scheduled through the 2017-2018 school year at each of our elementary schools and called "Saturday Coffee with the Superintendent." At the request of the community, we expanded the series to include four additional meetings on Sunday afternoons at our middle schools, as well as six more community meetings on weekdays and evenings at our high schools and at the Malberg Administration Building. The purpose? To bring the community into our conversation regarding our long-range strategic plan, "CHPS 2020: A clear vision for the future." The conversation also will include our upcoming bond referendum to be put up for public vote on September 25, 2018.

### Dr. Meloche Holds First Online Lunch Broadcast of 2017-2018

Dr. Meloche on September 29 held the first "Online Lunch with the Superintendent" live stream broadcast of the school year. He welcomed special guest Deena Caswell, Supervisor of Outreach and Diversity for the Cherry Hill Public Library, who spoke about the One Book, One Cherry Hill project, focused on *Songs of Willow Frost* by Jamie Ford.

Dr. Meloche also spoke about our schools' participation in the upcoming Walk/Bike-to-School Day on October 4, about the nearly finished installation of water refilling stations, about Hispanic Heritage Month and other topics. Enrichment Program (STEP)
for all CHPS elementary
school students when school
is closed for certain
holidays. Children do not
have to attend School
Aged Child Care (SACC)
to attend STEP Holiday
Child Care.

STEP Holiday Child Care is open from 7 am to 6 pm for the holidays of October 9; November 9 & 10; February 16; March 16; and April 2-6.

You must register your child in the STEP office at Cooper Elementary School, 1960 Greentree Road, no later than 5 business days prior to the date(s) you select.
