Bus Delays Likely in Coming Weeks

As with the beginning of every school year, we ask that you please be patient the first few days of school, when bus drivers are familiarizing themselves with the bus routes and pickups and dropoffs will likely run late.

This year will be particularly challenging for drivers whose routes coincide with the extensive road construction on Chapel Ave. west, traveling toward Merchantville. The construction project is expected to continue through the month of November. Delays are very likely for the duration of the project.

Additionally, PSE&G began repairing gas lines on Haddonfield Road between Dudley and Princeton Avenues on September 5. This work is likely to cause traffic delays. The work will be conducted around the clock and is expected to last three weeks.

Holiday Child Care Available to all CHPS Elementary Students

The Cherry Hill Public
Schools offers child care
through the Student
Enrichment Program (STEP)
for all CHPS elementary
school students when school
is closed for certain
holidays. Children do not
have to attend School
Aged Child Care (SACC)
to attend STEP Holiday
Child Care.

STEP Holiday Child Care is open from 7 am to 6 pm for the holidays of September 21 and 22; October 9; November 9 & 10; February 16; March 16; and April 2-6.

You must register your child in the STEP office at Cooper Elementary School, 1960 Greentree Road, no later than 5 business days prior to the date(s) you select.
