

Kilmer Students about Dangers of Smoking

Four Junior Cherry Hill High School West students on April 19 presented an inspiring and educational presentation to the fourth grade classes at Kilmer Elementary School as part of a service learning project that Mrs. Heather Esposito assigned in her 3A English class.

The purpose of the project was to have the high school students consider a social problem of importance and to try to inform and make a real difference in their community. After much consideration, research, and teamwork, these four students, Carolina Marro, Maria Vyzaniaris, Hikal Mazahra and Robert Blecha, pictured above, enthusiastically decided they wanted to teach elementary students about the dangers of smoking.

Using examples from what they have learned and witnessed among their peers, the West students created an informative lesson that the fourth graders were excited to hear.

The Assessment Office offers a <u>Learning Heroes Guide, "Get</u> <u>Ready for the Test" for</u> <u>parents in anticipation of the</u> <u>upcoming PARCC</u> <u>assessments</u>. This one-page guide was developed by Scholastic in partnership with the National PTA.

Congratulations to the staff of Eastside, Cherry Hill East's student newspaper, for being named the Most Outstanding High School Newspaper in America by the American Scholastic Press Association for the second year in a row.
