As we always work to improve in every way in the Cherry Hill Public Schools, we remember to look for tools and opportunities outside the CHPS community. Invaluable support comes from a variety of places.

March is a transitional month by nature: we experience winter turning to spring, with the first day of spring on March 20 and the characteristic turn toward warmer temperatures (and back again, several times over). We introduce the District budget for the next school year. We wrap up the third marking period. Winter sports teams celebrate the end of their seasons with banquets as the spring sports season begins. 

High School PARCC Testing Begins Tuesday, March 28

Parents of high school students should consult their school's web site for details on PARCC testing.

The CHPS Assessment Office offers a Learning Heroes Guide, "Get Ready for the Test" for parents in anticipation of the upcoming PARCC assessments. This one-page guide was developed by Scholastic in partnership with the National PTA.

AS a reminder, the State Board of Education has approved updated state regulations for the high school graduation assessments requirements in both English language arts (ELA) and mathematics for the Classes of 2017 through 2021, and beyond. PARCC testing begins for high school students on March 28, 2017 and for middle and elementary school students on April 19. Schedules vary according grade level and subject. The Cherry Hill Public Schools Assessment Office also offers an FAQ document to answer common questions about the PARCC assessment process. All parents are encouraged to read this FAQ.
