We received notification last night that the funding our school district receives from the state for the 2017-2018 academic year will remain flat. I am glad that we are not getting less money from the state, but as an educational community we continue to receive only about 40% of what we should receive from the state – 60% of what we should receive is being distributed someplace else. The "Fair Funding for Cherry" Hill Schools" committee has been active and alive indefatigable in their pursuit of our legislators and in their pursuit of Cherry Hill's fair share of state funding. As a reminder, the State Board of Education has approved updated state regulations for the high school graduation assessments requirements in both English language arts (ELA) and mathematics for the Classes of 2017 through 2021, and beyond.
