# Our Latest Opportunity for Conversation

We're doing all we can to keep the lines of communication open and reach our community members as they manage their busy lives. Now we're offering a virtual lunch date!

I had lunch with 22 of you today, and none of us had to leave the comfort of our office or home to participate. Instead, we met virtually at noon via computer on the <a href="District Livestream">District Livestream</a> page. I answered several community questions and offered a chat section on <a href="YouTube">YouTube</a> for folks to submit more written questions for me to answer live. For those of you who were unable to attend, the half hour session is now posted on the <a href="District YouTube">District YouTube</a> page for you to watch at your leisure.

Most people who know me well would say that I am rarely at a loss for words. Others would describe me as one who likes to hear himself talk! I would agree with both of those assessments, but in all seriousness, I most enjoy *hearing from* members of our community. Much of my talking includes invitations to become involved, not only in your children's performances, competitions and sporting events, but in the discussions at our Board of Education (BOE) Committee meetings (typically the first Monday and Tuesday evenings of the month), our BOE Work Sessions (typically the second Tuesday of the month) and our BOE Action Meetings (typically the fourth Tuesday of the month). This fall, we also held three Community Conversation meetings and offered an online survey to gain input from the public about our goal work into the year 2020 and beyond.

What I hear most from people when I encourage meeting attendance is, "Oh, I wish I could, but I'm so busy," or "I would have to hire a babysitter," or "It's just so hard to break away" from life's obligations, or even, "At the end of the day, I'm just too tired." All of these explanations are understandable. So we in administration sat down and said, "What can we do to make it easier on these folks to be connected, to participate?" The answer: let's use technology in a friendly, easily accessible way. A lunchtime offering seemed a good option for people at work or at home.
