Another session I attended with one of our board members and a district administrator has continued to generate discussion on how we are meeting the needs of all students and how we are integrating our work throughout the district. As adults, we learned. We challenged one another and we questioned our approach to the work within our district. Implementing a continuous cycle of improvement, with a commitment to inclusive student achievement, is fundamental to who we are as a district and as a community.
